#### The State of the Church Address

It has been QUITE a year! 2017 began with a time of prayer and fasting. That culminated in the 24-Hour Prayer Vigil. That Sunday, we celebrated Commitment Sunday- the day we had the opportunity to make our financial pledge for the year. Confirmation class started in February with young people spending Sunday afternoon deepening their faith!

The Easter season started with our Fat Tuesday on Ash Wednesday pancake dinner followed by the Ash Wednesday worship service. Then, on April 2, we celebrated Confirmation Sunday, baptizing 2 and bringing 3 into membership. Easter was celebrated on Sunday, April 16. Between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, nearly 1,000 folks worshiped with us!

April included The Journey Women's Event- a massive success. The rest of the second quarter saw the Survivor's Dinner and the Relay For Life event, among other things. Rhubarb Fest broke every record we had regarding number of meals served, number of pies sold and amount of money raised. At the close of June, we were up to 12 new members and 6 baptisms.

The third quarter saw the first anniversary of one of the most ambitious things a church can do- a third Sunday morning worship service. The Rock & Worship service has CLEARLY found an "audience" and averages just under 60 folks/week in attendance. Earlier in the 3rd Quarter, we had a building full of people as we held Vacation Bible School!

The fourth quarter has seen more amazing things. Wednesday Night Fellowship growing and strengthening. A record-breaking Trunk or Treat. An awesome year of Operation Christmas Child Shoebox collection. An incredible Follow the Star Holiday Bazaar. As of this writing, with December still to go, we have brought in 24 new members and performed 15 baptisms. More than 50% of the United Methodist churches in this country will bring in NO new members this year! We will end the year with a weekly average worship attendance of about 285 and a weekly average Christian Education attendance of 125. Both of those numbers are AMAZING!

AND... there was the launch of our Funding Our Faith Capital Campaign. After years of conversation and planning and months of dedicated HARD work, an all-church vote took place on Sunday, October 1. The plan passed overwhelmingly. We continue to focus on pledging to support the plan and get construction started as soon as possible.

This was just a partial list of all the things we did this year. I could fill this entire news-letter with the ministries this church offered this year. We are doing more and more things that connect people to Jesus Christ. And that means that more and more people are stepping up in powerful ways to help make that happen. Thank you for that!

The truth is that, as a church grows, one of two things will happen: they will either continue to adjust to handle the growth or they will contract back to what they can handle. We have experienced both realities in our 21 years of ministry and I simply don't have a gear for a church to pull back from doing God's work.

That means we have some stretching to do. The 2018 budget features a modest 2.72% increase over 2017. That represents the smallest increase we've had in a few years. But coupled with the Capital Campaign, we have an "uphill battle" ahead of us. But I know that, with God's help, it's a hill we can climb...and crest! I invite you to pray about the future of our church. Challenging days are ahead. And yet, we stand on the threshold of even more amazing things. And I, for one, can't WAIT to see what God has in store for us! It is truly an honor to be your pastor!


