

TIME TO COME BACK HOME!

2 Chron. 36:14-16, 19-23; Ps. 137: 1-6; Eph. 2:4-10; John 3:14-21

Last week the video of the documentary on Joseph Kony posted on YouTube went viral. For those who may not have heard about him, Joseph Kony is a Ugandan (East African) rebel leader, who for more than twenty-six years, has kidnapped tens of thousands of children, turning the girls into sex slaves, and the boys into child soldiers, forcing them to kill and/or mutilate their own parents and siblings. While this is a true story of maiming and killing, it is also a true story of slavery. The human mind is always yearning for freedom! These children desire to return and be reunited with their families.

Alienation can be terribly painful! You and I may not have experienced slavery, displacement or separation, but we may have seen it on television. Some may have read about it in history books – magazines – newspapers. The slave trade was a very painful experience. Apartheid and other forms of racial discrimination and oppression can be dehumanizing and demoralizing. Across the world today, prisoners of conscience – political and ideological prisoners – are being transported across the Atlantic to the Pacific. In today's troubled spots – Iraq, Afghanistan, Congo, Uganda, et cetera – many people are displaced from their homelands. They cannot return to the home they once knew. They are being held captive against their will by wars and violence. They yearn to be liberated from their bondage. They find themselves in a situation or in a place they would rather not be. They are alienated from their homelands – separated from their families and loved ones. They need freedom! They long to go home, but cannot!

Like the displaced people, you and I are separated from God's love because the beauty of Satan's deceptions has captivated us and thus, we are slow to say "no" to sin. We have estranged ourselves and have wandered away from God's love. We have become lax and complacent in our religious practices. We have preferred the dictates of the social media, ungodly politicians and irreligious leaders to God's commandments and the teachings of His Holy Church. Thus, we have become so used to the routine of the practice of our faith that it lacks any meaningful depth. We have so mingled with falsehood that we have allowed ourselves to be enticed into serving other gods in wealth and other material things instead of the Almighty God Who so loves us that "He sent His only Son to die for our sins."

This Lenten season, you and I are lovingly invited to take stock and to realize how alienated we have been from God because of our sins. It reminds us that a return to God is possible through Christ: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." Our faith challenges us to remember that the Cross of Christ is the symbol of our redemption and of God's unending love. Christ is the light that has come into the world, and if we need true freedom from slavery to sin we must choose this light above all else. Our complacency and relativism have certainly put us in a situation whereby we prefer darkness to light – Satan to Christ. Lent is an opportune time to break away from the darkness that oppresses and enslaves us. It is time to believe that our God is full of compassion and rich in mercy – always ready to forgive. It's time to come back home!



Sister Esther Byrne Goes Home To God

If we die with Christ we will also live with Him, because as the book of Wisdom says, “The souls of the just are in the hands of God, and no torment shall touch them.” The family of St. Bartholomew’s Parish has lost one of its gems, Sister Esther Byrne (Sister Mary Gerard). She was born in Manhattan, New York to Edward and Esther (Walsh) Byrne on August 27, 1927. She died on March 12, 2012 at the age of 84.

Sister Esther entered Religious life in the congregation of the Sisters of the Presentation at the tender age of 18 on September 8, 1945. She made her First Vows on April 26, 1948, when she took on the profession name, Sister Mary Gerard. She made her Final Vows on April 26, 1951. After her Final Vows, Sister Esther served in various Catholic Schools as a teacher for 25 years. Apart from working as a teacher, she had worked in parishes and a funeral home as a receptionist, as a RN and a Home Nurse to the elderly.

We were blessed to have Sister Esther work in our parish, St. Bartholomew’s, for 10 years (1988 – 1998) as a Pastoral Associate, under two pastors, Monsignors McManus and Case. All those who knew her and/or worked with her testified she was an amazing woman filled with faith and love of God and His people. Sister Esther devoted her time taking care of the homebound, the sick and the needy of our parish. She was a humble daughter of God, who never thought of herself, but always put the interests of the parish and the people first. She was beloved and adored by many in the parish, particularly by the ladies of the Rosary Altar Society, where she served as a Moderator during her stay in St. Bartholomew’s. She moderated the annual Lenten Retreat for the ladies until 2008, when her frail body couldn’t take the strain any longer. In 2003, the parish awarded Sister Esther with the Humanitarian Award for all the work she did at St. Bart’s and beyond.

I first met Sister Esther in 2005, when I was the Parochial Vicar; and when I took over as pastor in 2006, she visited me to assure me that I had her support and that of the ladies. She promised to pray for me everyday. I grew to admire and respect her so very much. She was like a mom or a big sister to me, and never failed to tell me how much she loved and appreciated the work I do here. She often wrote me notes to encourage me and assure me of her prayers. One such note written on January 24, 2009 reads: *Dear Fr. Anthony, my love and prayers are with you every day! May God continue to bless you with the courage and determination to always be the “Alter Christus” and “Good Shepherd” to every soul entrusted to your care. Your pastoral letter to your parishioners conveys the “Spirit of Jesus.” Indeed, you are truly a genuine son of St. Paul...May our Beloved Divine God accompany you very intimately every day in your humble, priestly service... Sr. Esther. She was one of my mentors and I will surely miss her.*

To celebrate the life of Sister Esther Byrne we, as a parish, are organizing a Memorial Mass where we will pray for the happy repose of the gentle soul of Sister Esther and for the consolation of her biological and religious families. The Mass will take place **March 24th**, in our Church at **10 a.m.** and will be followed by a reception (breaking-bread) at the McManus Parish Center. **Tribute by Father Anthony**
