Funeral services for Joseph E. Holliman, 57, of Oil City were held at 3 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 18 at McGuire Funeral Home Chapel in Vivian. Officiating was Rev. Frank Carroll, pastor of First Baptist Church of Oil City, where Mr. Holliman was a member. Burial followed in Lakeview Memorial Cemetery in Oil City under the direction of McGuire.

Mr. Holliman died Monday, Dec. 16, 1991, at his residence in Oil City after a lengthy illness. He was born July 8, 1938, in Wichita, Kan., and had been a resident of Oil City most of his life. He was a pipefitter and a member of the Plumbers and Steamfitters Local 141.
