BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

Article VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Dear AFBC Faithful Supporters,

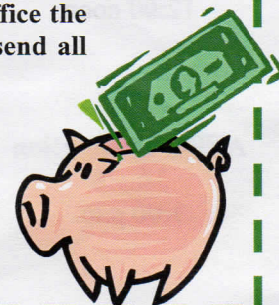

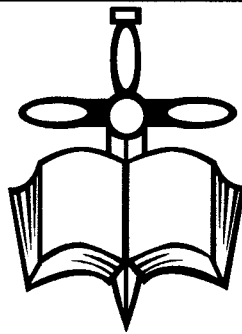

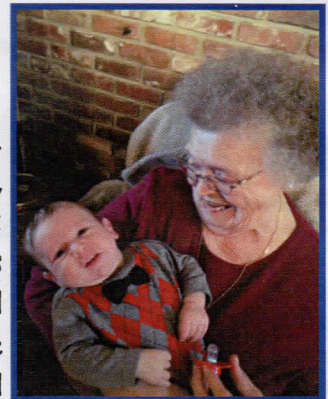

A Study In Holiness-Where Has It Gone?

Ron Noble– Follett, TX Part 1

Now I want to make some things absolutely clear! I want this to be so plainly stated that no one may misinterpret or fail to understand what I want to convey. I want no one to miss it!

First of all, the work that God does in us to save us is a Work of Grace. We had nothing to do with it.....well, except repenting and receiving. He does for and in us, not because we deserve it (nor can we ever be worthy enough to deserve anything) but only because of His great and matchless love. We have read many times of great verses such as Ephesians 2:8,9 “For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, Not of works, lest any man should .boast.” Period. There is no more. It’s His grace; His kindness and favor and benefit extended to us.....freely. It was His decision to offer. It is our decision to take, but His gift was and is without charge. Salvation is not gained or obtained by any work we do. We were not redeemed or ransomed by any amount of money we give or any amount of time spent in good causes, or no matter how much scripture one can memorize, or how often we go to church. We are not saved by doing! We were rescued and delivered from the penalty of sin by the sacrifice of Jesus.

Titus 2:11 and 14 is so great. Get your bible and read the whole verse as to get the context, but look at one of the reasons that Jesus came! “For the grace of God that brings salvation hath appeared to all men.....our Savior Jesus Christ; who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity...***It’s all because of what Jesus did on the cross***

Secondly, I want it clear, that not only are we saved through grace– we stay saved through faith in that grace. I had a preacher friend that often asked at the beginning of his sermons, “Have you stayed saved all day? “interesting question...don’t you think? After we are saved, is that it? Is there now anything required of us? Or do we just sit back, continue as we want and wait for heaven? I believe the Bible answers that clearly.

Ephesians 2:8 and 9 were mentioned but what about verse 10 ? “For we are his workmanship. Created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.” Did you read the full verse in Titus 2:11-14? The part I ‘left’ out was verse 12 and 13. “Teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world: Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God... and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. It states that ...our Lord Jesus Christ (is the one) who gave himself for us that he might redeem (deliver, liberate) us from all iniquity (wickedness, unrighteousness). Why?... “that he might purify (katharizo, cleanse, purge) unto himself a peculiar (special) people, zealous (most eagerly, desirous of, fervent in spirit) of good works (that which one undertakes to do, labor, deed)”. The Bible says in Matthew 5 to “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.” We Christians are to let OUR light shine that men may see OUR good works that God in heaven might be glorified. One of several questions that I have is, “Do others see God in how I live? There must be a departing from iniquity; not continuing in sin (read Romans 6 on your knees) an obedience to the command “go and sin no more.”(John 4)

Now in light of these verses and many others, the question of WHERE HAS THE HOLINESS GONE has been heavily upon my mind and heart, especially as I view the condition of the ‘Church’ today and of my own spiritual life. I have been impacted by a series of lessons that I studied called “Christianity AS SEEN in in the Book of Acts.” The words AS SEEN has struck me hard. As I continue in my Christian relationship with Jesus, I believe from what I’ve read in the Bible that Christ living in me and through me should be evident in how I am. He ought to readily be seen ...by all. I believe that there be a difference between those that say they are His and those that only take his name in vain; of those that claim that they are a part of the family of God, without really belonging to Him..don’t you? Now, many people profess to be Christians; they claim to be His, but,... The Lord knows them that are his. “Let everyone that names the name of Christ depart from iniquity.” I mean, hasn’t there been a wonderful change in you since Jesus came into your heart? But what kind of a change has there been since you and I professed Christ? Am I to be different that I was before? How different am I supposed to be? Enough for people to notice? The Bible says that Jesus came to make us “new”. But in what way? What do we want people to see that Jesus has done (and is doing) in us? Actually a better inquiry may be is what does God want others to see in us? What ‘observable’ behavior do we have that says I’m a child of God, a follower of Christ?

Have you ever thought of yourselves as being a sermon in shoes, walking around and ‘telling’ others the Gospel by how you live and what you say? I have, but perhaps I need to ask myself, “What kind of sermon am I preaching?” A very convicting song to me has always been “When The World Looks At Me , Do They See Jesus? ”. An important verse is I Cor. 10:31, “ Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatever ye do, do all to the glory to God.” Everything we do is to be affected by the living Christ for the purpose of bringing praise to God; to magnify Him and do nothing that would bring reproach upon the cause of Christianity.

Holiness—cont'd.

One of my teachers in Bible college told us that if we can't invite Christ to be part of every part of our lives, that part ought to be omitted. He also said that if our standards aren't high enough to offend the world, they aren't high enough. I believe firmly, God expects and deserves much more than 'service' that seems to be happening. There is to be a noticeable difference in how we live now as Christians compared to how we lived before we met Christ. It's a way of living: a state of 'being' that is called HOLINESS - (some of the meanings are) *sacred, morally blameless, modest, clean, innocent, consecrated*. All through the Bible this subject's spoken of, pursued, obtained by some and lost by others.

Leviticus 11:44a and 45b says : For I *am* the Lord your God; ye shall therefore sanctify yourselves, and ye shall be holy, for I *am* holy.... ye shall therefore be holy , for I *am* holy.”

I Peter 1:15,16- But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy.:

II Corinthians 7:1 says this: Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

I Thessalonians 4:7- For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness.
