Pastor's thoughts ...

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year,

Driving again... marveling at the hoarfrost on the trees and bushes early in the morning, enjoying visits with folks in nursing homes, buying gifts, wrapping, wrapping, wrapping, and then I finally stop to take a breath and once again contemplate Christmas. A blessing to all of us, bringing hope to the struggling, peace to the hurting, and love to us all. This time of year brings memories of loved ones, long car rides to bring us together, carols sung on front porch steps, working hard to find the perfect gift... and maybe receiving one too, and sharing meals with family and friends. It is a time for Christmas school programs and hopefully some renewal and refreshment, and although Christmas day has passed (when you receive this) its impact still resonates.

In the church, Christmas continues on for two more weeks and then we change seasons into Epiphany, the time in the church where we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the people of the world. 
