Part II - Homeward Bound

I was glad Bill and Donna didn't take us back on that Route 50 (longest and loneliest highway). They decided to go back home by way of Route 90 and 80 much nicer route.

Our first stop was Elko, NV. We stopped to see a relocated homestead called Sherman Station that had been converted to a Visitor's Center and Educational facility. (Bill found a Ford bench to rest on.) Next stop was Crates of the Moon in Arco, Idaho (It was really out of this world).

June 7^{th,} we made it to Yellowstone and saw Old Faithful (when a showoff goes off every 90 minutes) and saw hot springs and mud volcanos. We also visited the original location of the town which they now have a museum village set-up of various log cabins that were relocated there including the "Hole-In-The-Wall Gang's Cabin". d Jeremiah Johnson is buried here as well. In the evening Donna got to see her first Rodeo which was very exciting. I had a slight exhaust leak and the owner of the Big Bear Motel had a used car dealership with two lifts and he had me stop by and fixed it (I was purring like a kitten). We saw his collection of Indian bikes, cars and his '57 T-Bird as well.

Then it was onto a bunch of winding roads uphill/downhill around all these mountains to get to the other side – not fun! The elevations on these climbs were unbelievable! I was making a funny noise when they would turn my steering wheel to the right but we kept going. We made it to Mount Rushmore but on the way down I was making that noise whenever they turned my wheel (so we pulled over into a scenic overlook). Bill felt under my frame and thought the muffler was against the driveshaft). I won't go into details - called AAA and I was down the mountain in 2 ½ hours into Custer, SD where we were staying for the night. Bill and Donna did have a nice "Guardrail Snack" Dinner while waiting for the flatbed. Everyone was so nice including Dillon the Tow Driver. <u>Tech Tip</u> <u>Door Locks</u>

Try this on your Bird. Lock your door from the outside and then push hard a number of times on the outside button. Some of you may find the inside button slowly working its way up.
It is easy to over tighten the inside buttons and to do so may allow the situation above. The Birds came from the factory this way.

The problem is that when the button is screwed onto the shaft too far it limits available downward travel of the shaft. The result is that the lock mechanism is not able to engage fully.

The good news is that the fix is simple. Just unscrew the inside button a few turns to allow for more travel

From Rt.80 west...Go to Exit 26, "BUDD LAKE/HACKETTSTOWN" Continue West on Rt. 46 for 7 Traffic Lights approx. 5 miles Light # 1. International Dr. 4 miles

Light # 2. Village Way (Trading Post on left/Home Goods on right) .2 miles Light # 3. Woodland Rd. (BP Gas on left / Budd Lake Diner on right) .5 miles Light # 4. Mt. Olive Rd. (Valley Bank on right, Valero Gas on left) .7 miles Light # 5. Sand Shore Rd. (CVS on left, Budd Lake on right) .3 miles Light # 6. Smithtown Rd. (small strip mall on right) 1.1 miles

*Light # 7. Naughright Rd. (Johnson Dodge on far left corner) 1.3 miles *As you approach the 7th light be in the left turn lane

Then:

Turn **LEFT** onto Naughright Rd. go **3.3 miles** Turn **RIGHT** onto East Springtown Rd. go **.4 mile** Turn **LEFT** into Park straight to the end of the road (Handicap: after entering park turn right at sign "Family Picnic Site/Boat House" etc. Go to end , "Authorized Vehicles Only" sign, turn left go up hill to Handicap parking, next to restrooms and to the right of the Pavilion.)
