e are pleased to announce that Mack Industries, a well-known developer and builder of new construction in the south suburban area is investing in our community!

Their private investment of \$12 million dollars will build quality mixed-use residential and commercial properties located at the corners of Ashland and 124th Streets, (next to the Metra Train Station). This six acre site is currently vacant land and was formerly used for mobile home rentals. Most residents living in the area have seen the property become obsolescence and falling below minimum housing code standards (pictured at the right is the former mobile home court).

The Developer's plan is to bring sustainable and affordable apartment units with multi-retail use. Future plans are to convert these units to owneroccupied condominiums. The combination of location, features and amenities will also provide convenience to schools, recreation, shopping, and easy access that is within walking distance to the Metra Train Station.

We look forward to this private investment in our community that will enhance housing needs even more!



## A Message from Calumet Park Fire Department

Department enhancements and awareness keeps you safe

- Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms
- Test your smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working and if not, replace batteries
- There are two kinds of alarms. Ionization smoke alarms are quicker to warn about flaming fires. Photoelectric alarms are quicker to warn about smoldering fires. It is best to use both types of alarms in the home.
- When a smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.
- Replace smoke alarms in your home every 10 years.



## Tips for Responsible Disposal and Recycling

That does the beginning of the new school year have in common with Football (NFL), Hockey (NHL) and the World Series (MLB)? They are all indications that fall is here! With fall comes cooler temperatures, beautiful colors on the trees...and leaves on the ground. Village ordinance prohibits placing leaves and other yard waste by curbs and in the streets. This includes blowing (including using a lawnmower with no collection bag), raking, and sweeping them into the streets.

Please place yard waste in approved disposable bags by garbage containers for proper pick up. Don't place leaves and other yard waste in the streets or by curbs as this will block the sewers which could potentially increase the chance of flooding of the streets. Be on the look out for posted "no parking signs" as the street sweeper will be out sweeping the streets and trying to remove the fallen leaves starting in October.

For items that cannot be picked up during normal rounds by the garbage company such as couches, mattresses, T.V's and other large items, please call Republic Services (formerly known as Groen) at (708) 385-8252, and request a special pick up to avoid fines from the Village.

### WINTER TIPS FOR UNOCCUPIED HOMES

Winterize any unheated and unoccupied properties. This can be done by making an appointment with the Water Department to have your water turned off from the outside. Residents can also turn off water inside the home by closing the valve. The valve is located next to the water meter. Once the water is off, turn on your water faucets and drain the water from all water lines.

### STREET SIGNS

Phase I of the street sign replacement project is nearly completed. Residents on the west end of the Village (Paulina to Winchester) may notice that the new street signs are mounted higher in the air to eliminate vandalism. These signs have a new reflective material, lettering and numbers. We will continue to work on this signage program this year as long as weather permits.
