July 22, 2015: 3 month follow up WAB (BAB) - Commissioners Schrader and Wells
Representatives for State Rep Murphy and Commissioner Starkey.
Toured the Flood prone areas just days prior to the Rain Event.

July 26 - Mid August - Rain Event
9 month WAB on hold

September 11, 2015 - Pasco Rebuilds Together - PRT! was formed in an effort
for long term recovery of flood victims.



