VO-CAL is a private organization founded by a group of professional voice teachers for the purpose of promoting excellence in singing.

This Annual Competition is to provide an opportunity for singers to perform before a panel of outstanding adjudicators in a positive and constructive format. Singers receive written evaluations to assist them in growing as performers and musicians.

Winners recitals will be held the day of the Competition. First place winners will perform one piece at the recital. Prizes will be awarded to the top winners in each category.

Categories and Fees:

Classical and/or Musical Theater - \$40 per Category

*Division 1: 11 years and under

*Division 2: 12 – 13 years

*Division 3: 14 – 15 years

*Division 4: 16 – 18 years (High School)

*Division 5: 18 – 24 years (College)

Audition Information:

Students will prepare two contrasting pieces. Pieces must be age appropriate.

Original copies of music as required by Copyright Law must be given to the judges at the competition.

Saturday, April 22nd, 2017

Registration:

Go to www.vo-cal.org to register your students and for more information.

Accompanist:

Students will provide their own accompanist, or a staff accompanist may be provided upon request, for a fee of \$25 per student, per category. (No rehearsal available on the day of the event.) Teachers may not accompany their own students. Accompanists may play for a MAXIMUM of 18 students.

Eligibility:

Teachers must reside in the following counties: Orange, Los Angeles, Riverside, Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Bernardino, and San Diego.

Teacher duties:

Teachers who have participating students must volunteer on the day of the competition. Teachers may be asked to help in any of the following ways: Check-in, Door Monitor, Adjudicating, Hospitality, Set-up or Clean-up.

DID YOU KNOW?

Do you hesitate to enter students in our local events because of professional accompanist fees? Standing rule #13 states that "Accompanist fees for all recitals may be paid in part by the Branch. Each student is allowed fifteen dollars (\$15) per recital to a maximum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) per teacher per academic year. This fee cannot be paid for Certificate of Merit evaluations. Contact Treasurer Mary Inui if you wish to take advantage of this allowance.




