September 15: Healing & Renewal through Repentance and Forgiveness


September 22: Healing and Renewal through Community

OPEN DOOR YOUTH GROUP

Hello Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

I'm excited to start a new year of community, building relationships, continuing our spiritual journey, and engaging Our Whole Lives. Last year's focus was on getting to know your kids and finding ways to build relationships and this year we'll be building self-confidence.

I and Sara Verdick from Edwards UCC are asking parent(s)/guardian(s) of 7th-9th grade youth to attend an informational workshop on <u>Sunday, September 15th from 2-4 pm</u> at Hope UCC Moline regarding the Our Whole Lives (OWL) curriculum. This workshop is for parent(s)/guardian(s) <u>ONLY</u>.

OWL was created in the early 90s by the United Church of Christ (UCC) and the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). OWL is a progressive approach to sexuality education that deals with the totality of human sexuality in a developmentally appropriate manner. It is based firmly on the values of self-worth, sexual health, responsibility, justice, and inclusivity.

The UCC also created a companion to OWL called Sexuality and Our Faith. To offer sexuality education in a congregation is to acknowledge that human sexuality is simply too important, too beautiful, and too potentially dangerous to be ignored in a religious community. The goal of this resource is to connect faith with identity, relationships, and sexuality issues in ways that lead to informed and reasoned decisions and to empower youth to act responsibly as they seek to unite body and spirit, spirituality, and sexuality.

The workshop on September 15th for parent(s)/guardian(s) will mirror the youth workshops and a space to learn about OWL, ask questions, raise concerns, and consideration to move forward with OWL for youth.


Hope UCC New Website Under Construction
