- 1. All general rules apply to livestock entries Livestock entry forms due July 17 except 4-H · Market Lambs.
- 2. The Fair Management will not be responsible for any injuries to persons, livestock, or equipment The exhibitor assumes all risks of damage or loss to persons or property.
- 3. All entries must be on the fairgrounds as stated in the individual departments.
- 4. Livestock must meet state health regulations Animals will be checked by the livestock committee and any animal injured or suspected of carrying a contagious disease will not be permitted to remain on the fairgrounds.
- 5. All livestock must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor for at least 90 days prior to show. There shall be no evidence of market tags, etc and ear tags must be healed. The exhibitor must properly feed and water livestock on exhibit. Livestock and exhibit pens and areas must be kept in a clean and presentable manner or livestock will be barred from show or exhibit at the Fair. No bedding furnished by Fair Management. All pens assigned by chairman.
- 6. Entries must remain on the fairgrounds as directed by livestock chairman or forfeit premium and awards Release 9:00 p.m. or 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, unless permission of the livestock chairman is given.
- 7. Two entries may be made by an individual in each class unless other limits are specified for the department.

- 8. Management reserves the right to determine the number and arrangement of classes and to withhold the prizes awarded in any case in which regulations have not been complied with or that deception has been attempted or where the animal is not worthy.
- 9. Livestock entered in a Youth Livestock Department may not be entered in open livestock departments.
- 10. Heifers that have calves are not eligible to show, no Bulls over 6 months, and no horned cattle.
- 11. Junior livestock exhibitors will be age 13 and under and Senior exhibitors will be age 14 to 19 on the day of the show for youth divisions or as stated in individual departments.
- 12. Commercial cattle, dairy and goat exhibits may be from Tazewell and adjoining counties. Sheep may be exhibited by any Virginia Sheep Producers.
- 13. Any exhibitor or parent who interferes with the judging will be promptly excluded from the competition.
- 14. All Sheep must be docked and clean to be eligible to show.
- 15. Steers, geldings and wether goats, and lambs must show no evidence of testicular tissue and be completely healed from castration.
- 16. All animals are to exit at posted exit times unless approved by event chairman.





- 1. Registration paper must be available for all animals entered in breed shows. If no registration paper is available the animal will be places in commercial classes.
- 2. Classes for all Associated Breeds and Commercial.
- 3. A minimum of 6 cattle is required to hold a breed show. If the breed does not meet the minimum requirement, those heifers will be placed in All Other Registered Breeds.
- 4. Commercial Heifers will show in a separate class regardless of number of entries.
- 5. Fitting of breeding heifers in an ethical manner is allowed. Any animal fitted in an unethical way will be dismissed from the show grounds. Unethical fitting shall include (but not limited) the following:
 - a. Use of paints, paint products and colored adhesives or other fitting products are subject to breed association rules.
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls.
 - c. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal.
 - d. The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation.

- e. Any product/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.
- f. Aerosol cans used for grooming are not permitted in show ring or make-up areas
- 6. Cattle must remain on exhibit until release time. Premiums will be paid at release time. If animal is removed from exhibit area prior to release, all premiums will be forfeited.
- 7. Kids ages 8 and younger may only enter their calf in the lead line class.
- 8. Exhibitors must show their own animal in showmanship. The animal must be entered in the beef show.



- 3. A minimum of 5 sheep is required to hold a breed show. If the breed does not meet the minimum requirement, those sheep will be placed in All Other Registered Breeds.
- 4. Registration papers must be available for all animals entered in breed shows. If no registration paper is available the animal will be placed in the commercial show.
- 5. Senior lambs must be born September 1 to December 31 of the preceding year.
- 6. Junior lambs must be born after January 1 of the current year.
- 7. All sheep must be shown with 1/4" of wool or less above the knees and hocks. Fleece length will be checked when lambs are weighed.
- 8. Sheep must have scrapie tags in their ears.
- 9. All exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per class.


