Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

November is the time we usually set aside a time of Thanksgiving. A time to remember our blessings and celebrate them. As I review this past year I have so many blessings to give thanks for, most of all the chance to serve a loving, caring congregation, and the love of God that surrounds us in all times and all places, regardless of our circumstances.

1 Chronicles 16:34, and 5 Psalms say exactly the same words: "O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever."

Giving thanks, living out of gratitude, is an essential part of our relationship with God. What is it that you can be thankful for this year?

# Our November 20<sup>th</sup> bulletin will have an insert of a *Litany of Thankfulness and Praise.*

In case you miss it, I want to include it here:

L: Our God has loved us with an everlasting love.

C: In thankfulness and praise, we adore him in return.

L: Our God has created the whole world and everything in it for us to enjoy.

C: in thankfulness and praise, we laud our Creator.

L: Our God has surrounded us with people who care for us.

C: In thankfulness and praise, we share our time with family and friends.

L: Our God has sent us his Son to die on the cross for our sins for our salvation.

C: In thankfulness and praise, we worship him who gave us new life.

L: Our God is seen in gifts great and small of heaven and earth.

C: In thankfulness and praise, we treasure every bounty and blessing we receive by his grace. AMEN.

This would be a good prayer to use before eating our Thanksgiving Day meal with family or friends. Even though it is a responsive reading, it does not need to be spoken responsively.

The back of the insert gives us a few questions to ponder:

#### What gift of God do you treasure most? How do you see Jesus at work in your life? In what ways do you praise God daily?

I don't know if your family all eats at the table together, if they have deep conversations over meals, or if they are scattered watching football on TV as they eat, but these might be good questions to start a conversation. Or if religion isn't something you and your family talk about you can take a different track. I know one woman who always started meetings at church by asking, "What one good thing has happened to you this past week?" In this we were praising God through our life circumstances; even when someone had a difficult week, they could come up with one good thing that had happened to them. You could expand the time frame on this idea to asking what one good thing has happened to you in the past year rather than the past week.

By doing this, by taking time to express our gratitude in whatever way we so choose, I believe we put a distance between the celebrations of Thanksgiving and Christmas.



Now that heating season is upon us, it's a good time to look for places around your home where gaps or holes are letting your heated air out or the cold air in. You can fix air leaks with weather-stripping and caulking. This can reduce your home's energy usage through more efficient heating and cooling. There is lots of good information about home weatherization at <a href="https://www.energy.gov/energysaver/weatherize">https://www.energy.gov/energysaver/weatherize</a> Common places to look for gaps and leaks include:

- Around windows and doors.
- Around built-in light fixtures, particularly on the celling.
  - Around the chimney.
  - Around the attic door.
  - Gaps in the attic or basement.
  - Around plumbing as it enters a room.
    - Between the wall and the floor.
- Around electrical outlets, boxes, or other items cut into the wall.
