

42ND ANNIVERSARY OF ROE vs. WADE



As we mark the 42nd anniversary of the Supreme Court ruling on Abortion (the Roe vs. Wade case) this Thursday, January 22nd, we think of the adverse effects the practice of abortion is having on us as individuals and as a society. This decision has enabled the elimination of about 57 million pre-born children in America. It

provides a legal basis for a "culture of death" (Pope Saint John Paul II) in America. This culture sees death and dehumanization as solutions for today's problems, thus accepting abortion, euthanasia, unjust war, torture, neglect and abuse of the poor and needy.

The United States, avowedly a defender of the weak, has one of the highest legal abortion rates and the most extreme abortion policy of any industrialized Western nation in the world. To offer penance to Almighty God, for affronts to the dignity of the human person due to abortion and to pray for the full restoration of the legal right to life, the U.S. Catholic Bishops ask us to observe Thursday, January 22nd, as a day of prayer and penance.

One of our neighboring parishes, St. Joseph's Church, 141 Ashburton Avenue, Yonkers, has reserved a bus for the **March for Life** in Washington, D.C., on this Thursday, January 22nd.
