In July we "beat the heat" and organized a driving derby for Buddy Buggy Day at the Mcclure's place in Arroyo Grande.

A driving derby is a timed cones course (12 to 16 pairs of cones) with two obstacles included within the cones. So, for example, the driver drives cones 1-6 then drives the first obstacle (with gates A,B,C, and D) and continues to drive cones 8 -12, then the second obstacle, and finish with cones 14-16.

In total we had 9 or 10 drivers of all driving levels and sizes of equines. Everyone drove the course twice and their time combined determined the "winner". The VSE's were the winners as they hardly had to slow for the turns in the obstacles.

Thanks to the Mcclure's for opening their place for us to drive, Aleks for designing the course and being our timer, and Liz for being the "equipment manager".

Lost power Saturday but rolled out the big generator and connected it to the house. Ran freezer, refrigerator, and computers a couple of hours a day. We had ringside seats and were phoning neighbors to tell them to evacuate as the fire crested the ridge and headed into the canyon.

We don't evacuate so we experienced everything from the smoke to the tanker and helicopter water drops. David has incredible photos.


