



We are ready to make our vision of a new structure a reality! The new building will maintain the beauty of our current sanctuary, while making it all handicapped accessible.

The plan involves physically moving our current sanctuary to the open field north of the church. Additional space will be built for a fellowship hall, a nursery with its own restroom, a fireside and choir room, quilter's closet, a large kitchen with lots of work space, offices and storage areas. The cost for

this structure will be approximately \$1.2 million.

In order to begin building in the spring of 2018, we need to receive \$500,000 in pledges. We already have \$207,000 pledged! These pledges along with the \$212,000 already raised and hopefully the sale of some of our land would help us reach our financial goal.

A Message from Pastor Robert.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ.

It is no secret that the area all around our little country church is changing. Over the last decade Madison, Sun Prairie, and the DeForest/Windsor area have had major commercial and residential growth, and it doesn't seem like it is going to be ending any time soon. Our little village of Burke is being rapidly swallowed up by Madison and Sun Prairie both figuratively and literally. What was once a little farming community located just outside of Madison not only houses the corporate headquarters for one of the largest insurance companies in the nation but also has the largest hospital on the east side, right next door to our little country church.

This urban and suburban growth is not going to end anytime soon, as evidenced by the recent addition of two strip malls, a movie theater, a Cabelas, and several large residential developments just in the last two years. Meanwhile we have a Menards, a hotel, several apartment complexes, homes, and at least one new school being built nearby to accommodate all this growth. Farming land is being bought up all around us and many of the farmers are heading into retirement with a few extra pennies in their pockets (though some hold on keeping the sea of houses from completely taking over thankfully).

For good or bad, depending upon one's perspective this area is changing rapidly and the challenge we face as a community centered on the message of Jesus Christ is how are we going to live out our calling in this rapidly evolving environment? Unfortunately I do not have all the answers but I do know the greatest asset that we have as a community is you. 
Celebrating 90 Years

Lutherdale: Camp is Church

Jean Schnick and Sharon Hughes attended a Lutherdale meeting last month, and present the following:

- ◆ 570 signed up for camp this summer. That's 122 more than last year.
- ♦ Kids unable to pay are sponsored.
- Kids who go to camp are 3x's more likely to remain religious for the next 5 years than those who do not.
- 80.2% of Seminarians say what influenced them was being a camper or counselor at Bible Camp.
- It is a place of transformation. "My faith became my own at camp."
- Lutherdale will always be a camp for kids, but 51% of current camp usage is by adults.
- They developed the "50 Forward" programming because of the number of adults coming for camp usage.
- A new 20 room high-comfort lodge right across form the dining room is being built. There will be meeting space for 130 persons.
- ◆ Lutherdale served 10,000 guests this year. Their goal is 15,000.

Synod Assembly Summary 2017



Resolutions Passed

- I. Establish a Synodical Observance in Support of the Madison Area Jail Ministry and Its Jail Chaplaincy—passed with amendment to include establishing jail ministries in other counties in the synod
- II. 500 Years & Still Reforming—passed with amendments
- III. Becoming a Reconciling in Christ Synod—passed with amendments
- IV. Carbon Fee & Dividend, A Climate Solution
- V. Welcoming Refugees, Asylum Seekers, and Immigrants—passed with amendments
- VI. Recognition of Rev. David N. Larson's Service as President & CEO of Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin & Upper Michigan
- VII.Resolution on Preparing for the Women and Justice Social Statement
- VIII. Establishment of a Synod Wide Observance in support of Lutheran Campus Ministry

Notes from the Synod Assembly by Jean Schnick

The Keynote Speaker was Rev. Mark Tidsworth author of the book Shift. Here are some highlights from his talk.

- 1) Our churches are in transition. So what does it look like to be a disciple of Jesus NOW? As a church living in the "Post-modern era" we have yet to fully answer this question.
- 2) We understand that there are many ways in which people today view the world and God. We are very aware of the differences in religions, nationalities, races and the different denominations in the Christian church. We don't lift up our way as better than other ways.
 - a. We believe that this diversity makes our experiences more important in identifying truth and reality.
 - b. We are more open to spirituality and mystery than those of the modern era, because we believe logic and science cannot explain all of our experiences.
 - c. We believe there are ways of knowing beyond what we can see, taste and hear.
 - d. We distrust institutions.
 - e. We trust others based on genuineness and authenticity, no longer positions of authority.
- 3) Here are the questions that we typically ask when confronting problems in our congregations:
 - a. How can we get people to volunteer more?
 - b. How can we reach the younger people?
 - c. What worship style do we need to grow as a church?
 - d. Why won't people give more?
- 4) These are the questions that we should be asking:
 - a. What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus Christ now?
 - b. How seriously are we willing to engage Jesus' teachings?
 - c. When Jesus' followers band together in a group, what do they do?
 - d. If we wanted to form a group which helps its members to live out the teachings of Jesus, what would we do?
- 5) These are three big moves needed for the 20th century Modern Era church to shift into the 21st Century and the Postmodern Era church:
 - a. Member Identity to Disciple Identity
 - b. Attractional church to Missional Church
 - c. Consumer Culture to Sacred Partnering

- 6) The world is moving at a radically faster pace of change today. Our "disciples" will be living a life many of us have very little experience with. The church must shift to meet this changing world. Here are some examples from a You-Tube video called: "Did You Know?" released in 2008 that emphasizes just how fast the world is changing.
 - a. There are about 540,000 words in the English language. That's about 5x's as many as during Shakespeare's time.
 - b. It is estimated that 4 exabytes (4.0X's10 to the 19th power) of unique information will be created worldwide this year. That is more than the previous 5000 years.
 - c. The amount of new technical information is doubling every 2 years.
 - d. For students starting a 4 year technical degree, this means that half of what they learn their first year of study will be outdated by their third year of study.
 - e. 1 in 8 couples married in the U.S. met on-line. In 2015, it was 1 in 6.
- 7) 2016 You-Tube of "Did You Know?"
 - a. For the first time in history, we have 4 generations working side-by-side: Traditionalist / Boomer / Gen X / Millennial. They are all very different in the way they grew up communicating. Write me / Call me / Email me / Text me
 - b. If Facebook were a country, it would be the world's 3rd largest after China, and India.
 - c. Third generation fiber optics 10 trillion bits of information per second down a single strand of fiber.
 - d. Top 10 in demand jobs in 2010 did not exist in 2004.
 - e. US Department of Labor estimates that today's learner will have 10-14 jobs by the age of 38.
 - f. To reach a market audience of 50 million: Radio 38 years, TV 13 years, Internet 4 years, I-Pad 3 years, Facebook 2 years.
- 8) He ended his presentation by saying that God will provide what we need, to do what God calls us to do. There is enough time and capacity to do what He calls us to do. He bids us to "not be afraid" and "be of good courage". Mark Tidsworth reminds us that there is no room in love for fear. Well formed love banishes fear. God knows how to lead His people through transition.

This helped me to get a better understanding of what Burke may look like in the next 50 years. If you would like to learn more about his message for the "Post-Modern Church" please read his book <u>Shift</u> which is available on Amazon.
