Gait: Analysis and Equipment Selection

Length: 1 Hour

Description:

Gait trainers and walkers are frequently prescribed for children with motor impairments. The rationale behind the selection of a gait trainer versus a walker is based upon the analysis of several factors. This presentation will review the criteria used to select the appropriate type of device. Clinical indications for the selection of the components on the assistive device will be discussed. Criteria for device selection, the clinical rationale behind the selection, and set up of the mobility device will assist the attendee in supporting the medical necessity for the recommended device.
