The Golden Gathering: The framework is Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s last book published in 1967, "Where Do We Go from Here: Chaos or Community?" The crowning event examines the American Civil Rights Movement from past foundations to current mobility and grassroots organizing; and, exploring how new Civil Rights Movements are working through justice and peace to achieve positive social change. Illuminating MLK 50 is a cache of cultural-, social-, and civil activities including moderated discourse and storytelling; performing arts of original spoken word, music, plays, and liturgical dance; and, a visual art exhibit of creative pieces based on community artists (of all ages) interpretations' of the framework.
