SW-Jen Herr:Free APCO regional April 10th at Watchetaker Hall Lawton, OK 73507; still continuing with staffing issues throughout the region.

SE-Amber: Continue to introduce self to the region, McCurtain Co-operations reviewed with EMS being primary PSAP, plan to venture in the field and meet in person. Couple of agencies looking at new CAD systems, looking for locations for regional training-goal is to have a central location. Lance updates John Love, OKC reaching out for 3 day eclipse to ensure Choctaw and McCurtain county need extra help with radio coverage of 300-500 thousand people. Hotels are sold out. Ongoing work on getting that event covered. No reimbursement for travel, mutual aid only.

 Professionals: 911 Safe Act runs closely with this HB. The National APCO Conference will be in Nashville this year on this agenda.

 - i. Frequency Advisory Committee (Sean)-Frequency coordination continues to be busy, seeing most increase with VHF. Encourages everyone to keep Point-ofcontact updated, easy to maintain online. If you keep information up to date keeps the agency from missing notifications and reminders. Has experienced 3 where POC on FCC licensing not currently causing FCC notifications to be lapsed. VHF crowd don't want the license to expire. Anyone needing help can reach out to the SWIC office. Lots of attention on the upcoming eclipse 4/8/24. They are in the final communications response planning. Radio 101 training coming does have a long waiting list. Developing additional basic comms training. Has new radio 101 teachers. COMU Position-Specific Training Finalizing upcoming CISA training, INTD, COML etc. Good time to get your online portion done ie. INTD: IS-100, IS-200, IS-700, IS-800 & IS-144 INCM: Same as INTD plus ICS 300. **ORE**: Oct had op readiness exercise (during OKPSC) will be held every other year. The event was well attended and made it easier to complete task books. 2025 planning continues. Red River Comu a huge success. Will also be every other year opposite of the Central States training exercise. This year **Central States** Comms Association Exercise will be Sept 9th sch in Quapaw. Over 300 participants attended in 2022. Shared email and asked to reach out if needed to assist with communications. Thanks for all you do.

OK 911 Management Authority Office Update

o. State 911 Coordinators Report, Lance Terry - Appreciates leadership from APCO/NENA. Ken has brought many resources and knowledge together. SB966 interop govern board. Focuses on 2 things: creates a 9 position with 5 voting board members to oversee radio interop in OK. OMES/DPS/ODOT present plan for statewide radio included \$600 mil budget. Has concerns on the definition of statewide radio system. Not clearly defined. EM married to Homeland now divorced SB1371. HB 1590 update: Figures .06% off highest to the better for us January receipts should be what you collect moving forward. MA will see increased revenue internally as well. NG911 contract should be on the next 911 Management Authority agenda ad-hoc committee will oversee NG procurement; RFP for training open now. **Tito's training videos** continue to be published monthly by Gwen. Goal is to have several smaller videos to support one idea. I.e. 5 videos in support of reclassification: why is it important to you locally, provide education to local centers, etc. Proposed Rule Changes- public comments closed but you can visit the website to see changes. Encourages the public or anyone with questions to reach out to 911 MA board members for clarification on any concerns. Rules have expectations for PSAPs. **OKMaps**- shared website for GIS data; did publish address points and centerline data that was submitted to the state repository. This should make interop across the state better. Management Authority- have 2 board vacancies. Cybersecurity grant will be a snapshot of x10 PSAPS cybersecurity assessment. PSAP's will participate on a voluntary basis. This assessment will give the state a good base of what the concerns for cybersecurity concerns are.

9. Red Cross, Presentation - 2 state region (KS and OK); contact w/in 2 hours; only 1st responders 833-583-3111 not public. Red Cross of Oklahoma and Kansas-Duty Officer i.e. emergency dispatcher. Linda and Rick gave presentations of their program. Jan 1 had over 150 calls for response. Has breakdown of call history. They are in a crunch trying to get these needs covered. Have an amazing volunteer base. Flexible 4,8,12 hour shifts. You name dates/times you are available. Initial duty, backup and reserve officers who share in responsibilities of taking/handling calls Have in person and online training. X2 duty officers and DAT specialists are two who handle house fires. Both these positions are desperately needed. Linda asks for us to share flyers at any training or online. The Red Cross is actively recruiting volunteers and this is a high demand. Would love to attend training to spread the word or answer questions.

Rick-Paramedic with 35 years experience at OKC/Midwest City. History of in field contact as part of Red Cross. Transitioned to duty officer. Call/text/email three forms to receive information on call. Acknowledge call then must accept a call. Can close or refuse calls if too many are received at a time. Done from home. Has a validation process to ensure credentials before a call is handled. Once call details are validated via dispatch, first responder etc. Duty officers take that information to the DAT. DAT either accepts or denies that call. Duty officer then works the call tree. All volunteers go through training and are allowed to shadow until they are comfortable working on their own.

Initial Training online, call processing, job shadowing-average 3-4 hours at least. Lance T. asks about :Sch- sign up your self, Tax write off-unknown Benefits-personal satisfaction, SWAG Can scan the QR code, 1-800-redcross to join the team!
