THE BENEDICTION

Recently I had the privilege of visiting a church member during the last hours of his earthly life. He was unable to respond, but I read to this dear child of God words to strengthen his soul and faith, namely Psalms 40 and 23. I then prayed for him from my heart, and with him the Lord's Prayer. I ended with the Benediction, the words God told Aaron to speak over His people in Numbers: 6:24-26. There is no better way to commend someone to God than these words; here is why:

"The LORD bless you and keep you," acknowledges that only Yahweh, the sole true, eternal and creating God made and sustains us, purely because He is loving, merciful and patient to each person He has brought into being.

"The LORD make His face shine upon you and be gracious to you," proclaims that God has not rejected and abandoned us because of our sins and weakness but rather seeks us with undeserved forgiveness which returns us to His saving presence evermore.

"The LORD turn His face toward you and give you peace." This third statement reminds us that the Triune God, revealed to us as Father, Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit has done all that is necessary to restore us to everlasting life and a renewed relationship with God: the sending will of the Father, whose Son gladly and obediently died and rose to pay for our sins and then sent the Spirit to work in us repentance and faith in Jesus as Savior. This peace makes us whole and new in God's eyes and joins us to God in this life and will finally grant to us perfect, everlasting life in the world to be revealed when Jesus comes again in glory.

Of course, this blessing is not reserved for only the time of our imminent departure to be with the Lord; we end our worship services with this weekly and can speak it to each other before trips, surgeries and other trying or changing circumstances. It is a wonderful way to ask God's blessing on our fellow believers and can be spoken by any one of God's people. May this blessing rest upon all of us, by the grace and mercy of our ever-present Lord and Savior!






