It is noted from some teachers that they often learn more than they teach.....especially as they learn from their students and what is gained by pouring over material. I am finding that to be true as I teach the World Religion classes at Mitchell Community College. One idea that continues to stand out is what is central to a particular religion's expression. In the West, the word most used is "salvation." It comes from an understanding of healing, wholeness, completeness. Nothing wrong with that. We need healing for our brokenness and alienation. From the East comes the word "Wisdom." How should we live and how might we live wisely? Nothing wrong with that either.

The two words for the different locales can be broken down. In the West, it is found in the study of Theology; meaning, a word about God. In the East is found Philosophy; a love of wisdom. We are familiar with the idea of Christian theology. It the East, it would be Buddhist philosophy. What about the possibility of a Christian philosophy? We would not have to give up our theology in order to pursue wisdom. It might really serve to enrich our theology.

Among other things, I believe Jesus was a wisdom teacher. He never seem to want to just dispense knowledge, i.e. how many scripture verses can you memorize? Rather, he wanted to speak to that which would equip us to live in a world that seeks to both throw at us all kinds of opinions that are alien to the ancient prophetic message and to strip us of light and truth as we come to understand.
