

Ken Hancock was one of our PTP exchange students in 1987. For a number of years, he has been working in Budapest where he lives with his wife and son. A short while ago he was riding to work on his bicycle when he saw an elderly couple trying to cross the busy street. The woman was hit by another bicyclist and was obviously injured and in need of help. Ken stopped, and he soon discovered they could not speak Hungarian but were speaking German. He called for emergency assistance and then rode with them to the hospital in the ambulance so that he could translate for them. When the police officer took his report, the officer said, “You interest me. You speak fluent Hungarian, fluent German, you have an American passport, and you were born in Seoul, Korea.” It’s amazing how these international exchanges can prepare one for what lies ahead, even unexpected situations.
