

## I AM THAT I AM

Vs. 14 – A primitive root (compare H1933); to exist, that is, be or become, come to pass (always emphatic, and not a mere copula or auxiliary): KJV occurrences 3502

“And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.”

Vs. 15 – defined by the text — “From H1961; (the) self Existent or eternal; Jehovah, Jewish national name of God:” KJV occurrences 6521

“And God said moreover unto Moses, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, Jehovah, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, hath sent me unto you: this is my name for ever, and this is my memorial unto all generations.”

The I AM is thus defined as the self-existent one.

There are 31 names of God (give or take).

Elohim – Creator

Jehovah – Self-existent or Eternal

The names focus on the actions of God: what God does; God’s majesty; God’s power; God as a provider; Upholder; Righteousness of character, etc., not what God is called.

Look at the context and allow it to define how the term is applied.
