




SERMON SERIES

This training is open to all. If you are seeking to receive certification of re-certification credits you must attend all 10 hours of the training. We are offering the following class selections:

The Basic Lay Servant's Introductory Course (Joe Savastano)

includes a study of what it means to be God's called people and how we may be at work for God in our own communities. It includes learning opportunities for lay speakers in leading, caring and communicating.

<u>Advanced: Leading Missional Small Groups</u> (David Palmer) teaches missional foundations set by John and Charles Wesley. What it means to be missional, why we are called to be missional, how the means of grace shape us to serve missionally, what a missional community looks like, and how to organize one.

<u>Advanced: For the Common Good: Discovering and Using Your Spiritual Gifts</u> (RoseMarie Ash) offers a scriptural understanding of spiritual gifts. By helping participants identify and link their gifts, abilities, and sense of calling, they will learn the powerful connection between spiritual gifts and vocational discernment in the context of the mission of their local church.

<u>Advanced: Living Our United Methodist Beliefs</u> (United Methodist Heritage) (Rev. Dr. David Allen Jr.) will explore the special gifts of theology, witness, and organization that The United Methodist Church brings to the church universal, how we got where we are today, and how our distinctive emphases are still needed in the 21st-century church.

DEVOTIONAL BY MARY NORTHRUP Give Up or Get Up


A dear friend spent 40 years of his life as a quadriplegic. His first year or so was very difficult. He was stuck in a bed much of the time. There is no cure for a broken neck. He had no feeling from the shoulders down.

Therapy taught him to get out of bed and into a chair. He learned to manage eating and washing. He taught himself much more. He taught himself to walk with the aid of canes. Mind over matter you see. He would watch his feet and try to move them until he achieved success on a regular basis. Balance was a whole other ball game.

Most of his success came after he was told "you can't". He never quit trying and went on to live on his own, care for his aging mother, and eventually, a wife, child and grandchildren. He even volunteered at the library.

All of this happened after he came to accept that this was the rest of his life and he could either give up or get up. "There's more to come: We continue to shout our praise even when we're hemmed in with troubles, because we know how troubles can develop passionate patience in us, and how that patience in turn forges the tempered steel of virtue, keeping us alert for whatever God will do next. In alert expectancy such as this, we're never left feeling shortchanged. Quite the contrary—we can't round up enough containers to hold everything God generously pours into our lives through the Holy Spirit." Romans 5:4-5
