# **CLERGY COLUMN**

Brothers and sisters.

Up to this point in our exploration of the Sacraments, it's obvious to see that they are all given for our personal benefit. When I receive any of these five Sacraments, I personally benefit by receiving grace from the Lord. The focus becomes quite a bit different with the final two Sacraments, which are commonly called the Sacraments of Service. They are given this title because the benefit is not necessarily on the person who has received the Sacrament, but instead the benefit is meant for the salvation of others. We'll begin today with the Sacrament of Holy Orders and finish next week with a Sacrament very familiar to many of us, Holy Matrimony.


Holy Orders refers to anyone who has been ordained in the Catholic Church (note: Protestant ministers do not receive this Sacrament, nor do they really transmit any Sacraments except Baptism), namely bishops, priests, and deacons. The bishop lays hands on them, or in the case of an ordination for a bishop it is two bishops who lay hands, which signifies Jesus himself laying hands and pouring his Holy Spirit upon the man being ordained, giving him gifts proper to the ministry. The bishop also anoints the hands of those being ordained priests and bishops, signifying the seal of the Holy Spirit upon their souls, a mark that lasts into eternity.

The origins of this Sacrament actually is found in the Old Testament. We know there were twelve tribes and that the Lord wanted one tribe, the Tribe of Levi, set apart for liturgical service. There was a special rite that consecrated the priests who were to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins on behalf of the nation. Their primary task was to proclaim the Word of God and restore communion between God and humans, which had been broken due to sin. We know that ultimately only the sacrifice of Jesus could restore this communion, but the Church still sees this rite as the foundation for the New Covenant established by Jesus. While he does something new, he also works in continuity with how God had been active among his people throughout history. Ordained ministers of the Church are not their own person, but instead participate, share in the ministry and priesthood of Jesus.

The grace of the Sacrament makes it possible for the ordained minister to act as a representative of Christ in a real and formal way. He is configured to Christ so that he may be an instrument of Christ. It is only because of this Sacrament that the bishop, priest, and deacon are able to make Jesus present in the other Sacraments.

If it is the minister of Jesus who makes Jesus present in the other Sacraments, then we can see that this Sacrament of Holy Orders can only be a Sacrament received for others. As a priest, my life is not for me, but it is for you, the People of God who need to receive his grace in order to be able to live the Christian life. Of course, it is a gift that he has called me to share in his ministry, but the gift is ultimately meant for people other than me. Next week we'll look at a similar line of thinking with the Sacrament of Matrimony.
