What is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament?

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, or Eucharistic Adoration, is an opportunity for the faithful to pray to Jesus Christ before the Eucharist at their local parish. But what makes praying during Eucharistic Adoration any different than the prayers you say throughout your daily life? True, you can pray to God anywhere. God is omnipresent, which means He is everywhere at all times. As the Word of God says in Proverbs 15:3, "The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good." God is always near, and thus, you can always enter into His presence in prayer.

Eucharistic Adoration differs from your daily prayers in one key aspect. Catholics believe the body, blood, soul and divinity are substantially present in the Eucharist. In other words, when you participate in Eucharistic Adoration, you pray and worship Jesus in a more intimate, present and real way. ~ catholicworldmission.org
