

The Virtues

\$1803-1804

"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise think about these things."

A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself. The virtuous person tends toward the good with all his sensory and spiritual powers; he pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions.

The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God.

Human Virtues

Human virtues are firm attitudes, stable dispositions, habitual perfections of intellect and will that govern our actions, order our passions, and guide our conduct according to reason and faith. They make possible ease, self-mastery, and joy in leading a morally good life. The virtuous man is he who freely practices the good.

The moral virtues are acquired by human effort. They are the fruit and seed of morally good acts; they dispose all the powers of the human being for communion with divine love.

SAINT POPE JOHN PAUL II **Feast Day October 22**

"Open wide the doors to Christ," urged John Paul II in his homily when he was installed as Pope in 1978. He was a man of our times and for our times. He was deeply engaged in the

world, in our faith and in the spiritual needs of all. He embraced the world as no other Pope had done and he was much admired and loved for it. When elected Pope he was the first non-Italian Pope in 455 years. In time, he made pastoral visits to 124 countries. Throughout his papacy he promoted numerous ecumenical and interfaith initiatives: established diplomatic relations between the Holy See and Israel; improved Catholic-Muslim relations, and relations with the Orthodox Churches improved considerably during his papacy. A worldchanging event occurred on his 1979 visit to Poland when he encouraged the growth of the Solidarity movement there which helped to promulgate the collapse of communism in central and eastern Europe ten years later. He attended all four sessions of Vatican II and contributed especially to its Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World. He was canonized in 2014.
