This month there is something new only for AWG members. It's our "Flash Spotlight". So, if you haven't already joined our Guild, you might want to go ahead and pay those dues, because you will have many opportunities to hone your skill over the next 12 months!

There is more information on page 3, but your Board wants to encourage everyone to put your creative caps on and join the fun. You will receive five (5) prompt words, all of which must be used in your story OR poem, but NOT in the title. It's entirely up to you whether you do a story or a poem, BUT you are limited to one submission for each group of prompt words. Check the first set and start thinking about an interesting, surprising, thought-provoking story or poem. Send your "Flash Spotlight" story or poem via email to: Trliso3@hotmail.com.

PLEASE list the five prompt words in the email subject line.

Center the title on your email page, PUT YOUR NAME under the title of your story or poem, skip a line and type your story or poem.

Once submissions are in, they will be read and reviewed. Two will be published in an upcoming Newsletter. It should be fun to see how different people handle and use the same words. If Jo has more room in the Newsletter, we may publish more than two. We may publish more stories or poems using the same words in the following Newsletter or move on to new prompts. It all depends on your participation.

Don't confuse this with our Annual Writing Contest which opens October 1 and runs through November 30, 2019. Anyone age 15 and over may enter. Rules for the Annual Writing Contest are in this Newsletter and are published on our website. All these entries must be mailed with payment attached for each genre or poem. See the entry form below. Entries postmarked before October 1 or after November 30 will not be judged nor will they or the payments be returned. No email submissions are accepted in the Annual Writing Contest.

Be sure to follow the rules. (You knew I would toss in that advice!) Some are slightly different this year, so read carefully. Remember, for the Annual Writing Contest, the writer's name goes ONLY on the cover sheet and NEVER on the entry itself, but you must put the title of your submission on your entry. Enter as many times as you wish! You may staple checks to the entries.

Looking forward to receiving submissions in this new Flash Spotlight and entries in our annual contest! Ready, set, GO!

ABILENE WRITERS GUILD'S ANNUAL CONTEST 2019 -2020

General Information: Open to any person age 15 or older. Entries must be your original work, unpublished as of October 1, 2019. Publication on the internet is publication. The work must not have earned a cash award in any previous AWG **Annual** Contest. However, Honorable Mentions from past contests may be re-entered. All AWG monthly members-only-contest entries are eligible. Use **ONLY** Times New Roman or Arial font size 12. No fancy fonts! Type only on one side of each page. No limit to number of entries that can be submitted.

Entries must be **postmarked** between Oct. 1 - Nov. 30, 2019. Entries posted earlier or later than those dates will NOT be judged nor will fees be refunded. Categories will not be judged if there are fewer than 5 entries.

Cover Sheet: Each entry must have a separate cover sheet. Do not put your name on any other page. Cover sheet instructions:

Upper left corner: your name, complete address, telephone # and email address.

Upper right corner: list the category, then the number of words or lines.

Space down to center of page and center the title.

POETRY Catagories 1 and 2: Center the title at the top of the first page. List number of lines in upper right corner. Double space down and begin. May be single or double-spaced. Do **NOT** put your name on your poem.

FLASH POETRY Catagory 9: Same rules as for Categories 1 and 2, but list number of words in upper right corner.

CATAGORIES 3-8: Center the title at the top of the first page only. Double-space and begin typing. Double-space all pages. On all other pages: upper right corner, type title and page number. Do NOT put your name on any of these pages!

Other Information: Staple separate coversheet to each manuscript or poem. Attach your check(s) with a paperclip. One check may cover multiple entries, but each entry MUST have its own cover sheet. If you want your entry/entries returned with judges' comments, please provide a large SASE with adequate postage. Entries without large enough return SASEs will be destroyed after April 30, 2020.

Reminder: Please follow the guidelines. Decisions of the judges are final. Prizes will be presented March 21, 2020, at our Workshop. Please check our website and/or Newsletter for registration, time and place details.
