Hearing the Voice of God By Marge Virnig

It has always struck me that God spoke on a regular basis to ordinary and unsuspecting people in ancient times and they seemed to take it in stride ... "Build an ark," "Leave everything you have and go to a land I will show you," "This is sacred ground," "I Am Who I Am," "This is My Beloved Son," "Saul, why do you persecute me?" etc.

Today, if someone says the Lord spoke to him/her the first reaction might be raised eyebrows, a skeptical look, or the quizzical therapeutic response, "Tell me more ..."

I think the important point to consider is that God is a God of love who has been communicating that love to all of us throughout history. This communication happens in a myriad of ways: liturgy, family, friends, nature, scripture, our five senses, music, the arts, to name a few. Some would argue that it could possibly happen through social media and technology, and that might be true. Maybe God is Tweeting through #PopeFrancis.

Our challenge is to be attentive and discerning. Maybe in ancient times people had more quiet time and fewer distractions, but that's not the case in my life. I need to be intentional in taking quiet time when I can be aware of God's presence. I also need to be around people who can help me discern what is of God and what is me. When left on my own, I tend to put words in God's mouth, and then I am pleasantly amazed when God tells me exactly what I want to hear.

The beauty of belonging to a faith community is that we are all seeking God together. We gather each week to experience God and then we scatter to share that experience in our ordinary lives. As the Beloved Children of God, let us pray that always and everywhere we faithfully communicate the truth, beauty and goodness that is God.

Young Voices Choir


The choir will have practice following 10am Mass on March 4th and 11th in preparation for singing the prelude at the Stations of the Cross on March 14th.
