I Am the Vine

(Fourth Sunday in Lent)

The vine draws food from the earth to provide the branches with nourishment. When the branch is severed from the vine, it withers and dies. Likewise, it is through the branches that the vine bears fruit. The mutual indwelling of the vine and the branches results in fruitfulness.

When Jesus referred to himself as the vine and to us as the branches, he was alluding to the life giving force that he brings into our lives. Apart from him, we become wracked with personal problems; our ministry becomes little more than a hectic round of committee meetings and activities; and we experience very little spiritual growth. As a part of the vine, we become fruitful. Our witness to the Lord Jesus Christ becomes productive, and our ministry brings glory to the living God.

The vine cannot bear fruit without the branches. When we do not witness and others do not experience the love of God through us, the vine is barren. With Christ as the center of our lives, persons experience the nature of God through our lives. They see Christ mirrored in us, and we bear fruit for the vine.
