REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence. List of programs the organization supports are posted on the bulletin board in the hallway.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart and other stores next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, toothpaste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. **Place items on the table located in the pantry on your left as you enter.**

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

January is Human Trafficking and Stalking Awareness month. *Reach is leading our community in eliminating domestic violence and sexual assault through education, advocacy, self-empowerment, and community awareness.*

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We need your help to keep our pantry stocked. If no family, or individual has made a special request; then, items are taken off the shelves and taken to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Most of the clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent to wash their clothes, hygiene items, e.g. shampoo & conditioner, toothpaste, soap or body wash, etc. **Lula also includes assorted chips and crackers to give to the homeless who sit outside next to the food bank.** The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

To whom much is given, much will be required (Luke 12:48). If you have heard that line of wisdom, you know it means if we have been blessed with talents, wealth, knowledge, time, and the like, it is expected that we benefit others.

Epiphany - also known as Three Kings' Day - is a Christian feast day which falls on 6 January. It is a special date for many Christians as it's when people celebrate how a star led the Magi - also known as the Three kings or the Wise Men - to visit the baby Jesus after he had been born. The **manifestation** of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12)

The three wise men, also known as the Magi, were a group of people who traveled to pay homage to the newborn Jesus and brought gifts.

Matthew never records how many wise men came to honor Jesus. We know there was more than one because of the plural use of "men." Most people assume there are three because of the three gifts they gave, as recorded in Matthew (gold, frankincense, and myrrh).

The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh given to Jesus by the Magi, or wise men, had symbolic meanings that represent different aspects of Jesus' identity:

- **Gold**

Symbolizes Jesus' status as the "King of the Jews" and his divinity. Gold was a precious metal used to make the Ark of the Covenant and pagan idols.

- **Frankincense**

Symbolizes Jesus' deity and his willingness to sacrifice himself. Frankincense was a white

resin or gum that was burned as incense in the temple and was used in sacred oils and perfumes.

- **Myrrh**

Symbolizes Jesus' mortality and death. Myrrh was an embalming oil used to anoint bodies.

In the Book of Matthew, the magi stopped at Herod's palace on their way to Bethlehem, and the king asked them to let him know where this newborn babe was, so that "I may also go and pay him homage." But the magi were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, and so they left for their own country by another road".

40th ANNIVERSARY

Murphy church had its' beginning on September 3, 1984. Services were held at the home of Dan and Linda Kirby until construction was completed on the church building.

Because of the water damage to the flooring in the kitchen and the back of the main auditorium, we had to change the 2024 date twice. Now we are in negotiation to repair the breezeway entrance to the church.

We are still in the discussion phase pending feedback from the congregation as to whether to plan to have a Homecoming in 2025 to celebrate 41 years.

It was somewhat of a homecoming for Dan and Glenda Kirby and several of the Kirby family members were in attendance on Sunday December 29th, the last Sunday in the year 2024.
