The Words You Don't Want to Hear

By now, you are probably WELL aware of my..."news". It all started in later May. I was feeling some "crud" in my throat and I was having some difficulty swallowing. But the "crud" wasn't too bad and the swallowing problem was intermittent. So I chalked it up to "a cold". But it persisted and some other symptoms startedneck swelling and some tenderness. So on Monday, June 5, I said to Joanne, "I think I need to see the doctor." The next day, there we were. She checked me out and sent me for a CT scan, which was on Wednesday, June 7. The next day, we were called back to meet with the doctor- the news wasn't great. "Necrotic" thyroid and lymph nodes in the neck. If the term "necrotic" doesn't resonate with you, it means "dead tissue".

From there, that same day, we drove to the ER at the University of Iowa Hospital in Iowa City. After exams, scopes (not fun!) and blood work, it was determined that they needed to do a needle biopsy. It wasn't going to happen for a few days, so (After some "conversation" about how I did NOT want to stay overnight there!) they sent us home. But the FIRST thing the next morning, they called and said, "Be here this afternoon!" So Friday, June 9, we drove BACK to Iowa City, where they did not one, not two but TWELVE needle biopsies on my neck. We then, again, went home.

Since then, I have had another CT scan- this one on my chest. I have had a PET scan- top of head to knees. We have met with an Otolaryngologist (Think- ENT.), not one but two Radiology Oncologists, an oncology who specializes in chemo administering and another Oncologist, as well as the tech who administers the chemo, a dietician and a social worker. Oh, and I was fitted for the "mask" I will wear for the radiation treatments. (Now THAT was a trip to Hollywood!) Chemo (once a week) and radiation (5 times a week) began Monday, June 26. They will run for only two weeks, ending on Friday, July 7. (That means that we will spend part of the Fourth of July AND part of our 32nd anniversary (7/6) getting the radiation treatments!

The bottom line is this- the diagnosis is Stage 4 Anaplastic Thyroid Cancer. There is no known cure. The treatments are designed to "knock things down" a bit with the hope that I can be a part of a Clinical Trial. In other words, we simply do NOT know where this will take us. But what we DO know is that we will face it head on. We refuse to surrender our joy to this disease. We refuse to mope and wallow in self-pity. We refuse to waste a moment on those things. Every day is a gift from God. And NONE of us know how long we have on this earth. And so- we live each day to the fullest. We continue to strive to be the people God is calling us to be. Joanne, Hunter, Sam and I are honored to be a part of The Aledo United Methodist Church family. We can't imagine a better congregation to serve than you all. And so, we take this a day at a time, a moment at a time. And we do it with our heads held high and full of gratitude for the love and support you show us. And we do it determined to say, every day, as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord!

HOW IS OUR CHURCH DOING FINANCIALLY?

There are a couple simple rules to keep a church financially strong. (1) Control expenses, and (2) Generate sufficient income, receipts, donations, cash flow to pay the bills.

We have always done a good job controlling expenses at the church. As of the end of May we were underspent approximately \$16,000 compared to what we had budgeted. This is the part of the equation the church leadership can control.

The other side of the equation is of course receipts – income – cash flow. While church leadership can influence this somewhat, real control over this side of the equation is with the church members and friends of the church. As of the end of May donations to our church were short of budget by approximately \$27,000. The difference between our cost saving and shortage on donations is \$11,000. This is the amount that we need to get back to even and pay all of our expenses. When I looked at Year-To-Date giving to the budget for 2017 at the end of May, we are approximately \$8,000 short of last year.

While church leadership will continue to monitor and control our expenses, we need the help of church members and friends to do their part by helping where you can to increase donations to the church. If you are already doing what you can – thank you very much. If you are in a position to start giving, catch up your pledge or give something additional, that would be great because our church needs your help. Working together, the church leadership and our members have all the skills and resources needed to keep our church financially strong. Please don't let finances restrict all the good things our church is doing to "Connect People with Jesus Christ".

NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, July 9, we begin a new sermon series. One of my favorite singer/songwriters of all time is a man named Rich Mullins. A Christian writer/performer, Rich wrote amazing poetry about our relationship with God that he was somehow able to also write beautiful music to support! Sadly, Rich was killed in a traffic accident outside of Peoria, IL on September 19, 1997.

Over the course of 1991 and 1992, Rich released what became a two-album set of songs that he called The World as Best I Remember It. The music is great, to be sure. But the title of the album always stood out to me. His goal, through that two-album set, was to put forth his understanding of the word, of life. He wanted to say some things to his listeners about life and what he had learned about it.

Originally, I had planned another round of what has become a summer sermon tradition for us- The Psizzlin' Psummer Psalm Psermon Pseries. But since my health issues cropped up, I have decided to put that on hold. Instead, we are going to spend the rest of July...and perhaps beyond, on a series whose title is unashamedly borrow from Rich Mullins- **The World as Best I Remember It**.

The series will be built around what I think is important. They're the things I would want people to build their spiritual life around- "hang their hat on", so to speak. I'm not going to lie- some of it might make you squirm a bit. But the truth is that, if something in this series makes you squirm a bit...you probably need to squirm a bit.

Now don't misunderstand and don't worry- it won't be weeks of me yelling at you or trying to make you feel bad! Not at all. Instead, we will talk about what's REALLY important in life. And, perhaps more importantly. What's NOT so important!

If there has EVER been a time to step out in faith and invite folks to church...it is now. God is moving in powerful ways at The Aledo United Methodist Church. And God is using this stinking cancer to reach...and using me...in ways He never has before. This series is shaping up to be the best, most important sermon series I have ever had the pleasure of offering. Please share it with others. Why? Because our goal, as always, is to connect people to Jesus Christ!

church anyway! Do you feel God calling you to step up and help? Talk to Rev. Mark. Mike Millar or Ruth Dulaney.







C.I.A. (CARING INDIVIDUAL ADULTS) LUNCHEON- SUMMER VACATION



During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee but with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty...from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more." Adams' prediction was off by two days!

In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary. President James Monroe died exactly five years later, on July 4, 1831.

We have much to be grateful for in this country. Celebrate our nation's independence- thank God for our freedom!
