OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOXES 2020

Our church will be participating in the Operation Christmas Child shoe box campaign again this year. The filled boxes are due at the church by **November 15**.

Pick your age category, shop for the gifts to fill the box, and then pack and bring for dedication. Shipping for one box is **\$9.00**. Please make out checks to United Presbyterian Church with shoebox on memo line. If gift wrapping, do top and bottom separately as all boxes are opened and thoroughly checked before shipment.

If you need a shoe box call the church office (358-4255) we have a supply.

GIFT SUGGESTIONS:

TOYS: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy trucks, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yo's. jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (include extra batteries)

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons, markers, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and/or picture books

HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrushes, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER: t-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

DO NOT INCLUDE used or damaged items, warrelated items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures, chocolate, any candy, liquids or lotions, toothpaste, medications or vitamins, or anything containing glass.

PERSONAL NOTE: including a picture or note to the child along with your name and address may result in correspondence from the recipient.

AGE CATEGORIES: 2-4 years; 5-9 years; 10-14 years, either a boy or a girl. Use label (on table at the entrance) and attach to top of shoebox.

ECUMENICAL COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DAY DINNER

The area churches will be preparing Thanksgiving Day dinner at the Randolph Fire Hall However, due to COVID-19, there will be NO sit down dinners. There will be only <u>deliveries leaving at 11:30 or drive through for pick up from 12:30 to 1:30.</u>

That means we need only two sets of work crews at the Fire Hall on Thanksgiving Day to prepare the dinners:

Kitchen Crew-8 am-12:30

or in shifts 8-10, 10-12:30.

Drivers at 11:30

We will need volunteers to take home the stuffing and potato pearls (already donated) and prepare them for delivery to the Fire Hall at either 8 am or 10 am on Thanksgiving Day. If you have an extra oven or roaster, we need people who can roast a turkey and bring it to the Fire Hall either 8 am or 10 am on Thanksgiving Day. We will give you the turkey and roasting bag. 
