Program from January 2020 Cambridge Rosepoint

Al and Genny Melillo presented their beautiful collection of Cambridge Rosepoint and Syracuse China. Their collection began with their parents. Jenny's parents, pictured on the photo plate, were married in 1928 and were given a small collection of Syracuse China and Rosepoint glasses that were added to over the years. Some special pieces include: 13 ½ inch 2 handled cake plate (above on right), sugar/creamer, center piece bowl, relish dish, vase, candle sticks (above in left photo), a celery tray picked up at our last show, and more. Al brought his mother's 32 oz. Cambridge Ball Jug Decanter in Amethyst (holding up in top picture).

Cambridge produced 12 different etched patterns from about 1901-1959. There is a non-profit museum in Cambridge OH.

Syracuse China was founded in 1871 in Geddes NY and is today one of the world's leading supplier of commercial china for the food service industry.
