Avoiding the Summer Slump

Did you know that children who do not practice reading and math skills over the summer break can lose as much as two months of the progress gains made during the school year? Happily, these losses can be avoided with a few simple steps.

Be a Bookworm!

- •<u>Six books to summer success</u>: Research shows that reading just six books during the summer may keep a struggling reader from regressing.
- *Visit the library visiting the library is a fun and free way to keep reading motivation strong.
- *Keep reading aloud: Reading aloud benefits children through their teens! One benefit is that you can read books your child can't, so she will build listening comprehension skills with grade-level and above books. Reading the same book can also stimulate rich family discussion.
- **Go Multimedia:** Read newspapers, magazines, comics, and online sources. For example have your child follow a recipe online Or complete a STEM activity.
- *Use our district digital resources: Many online digital resources such remain available to students during the summer months. Have your student check out the www.orangeusd.org dashboard to see what's available.

The Quantile math challenge works with the Math Inventory "MI" assessment score we use at school to provide daily simple family challenges for students. •Get Shopping (and budgeting!) - Shopping is a great opportunity to practice all types of math computation. Planning and budgeting is even better. You can even turn this into a financial responsibility lesson by helping children plan how to earn money for a special treat or outing.

What about writing?

Write old fashioned notes to family members and friends. Special pens, paper, or a family mailbox can make this a real treat.

Create a family story- Here's a fun idea to motivate your students. Have one family member begin a story, and continue passing the story to different family members who can add their own twist. You never know where the story will end up!

2019-20 School Year Pertussis (Whooping Cough) Immunization and Varicella Requirements

All 7th Grade Students will need to Provide Proof of a Pertussis Booster and 2nd Varicella vaccine.



On July 1, 2011, California Assembly Bill 354 requires that all 7th grade students entering school for the 2019-20 school year will be required to provide proof of a Tdap (Pertussis) booster. This may be met by receiving this booster on or after your child's 7th birthday.

Be Safe at Morning Drop Off and Afternoon Pick Up!
