

## Do the waters of baptism flow into society or do they form a moat around the church?

This was the sending forth question at a presentation I attended about 25 years ago that continues to challenge and inspire me. It surfaced again last Sunday after I attended one of the pre-Synod listening sessions and heard a wide range of comments from people throughout the Archdiocese.

I hear a wide range of responses to the Synod in general ... hopeful, apprehension, curiosity, cynicism, optimism, etc. I'm convinced that no matter where you stand, your participation is important. Everyone's input is needed to help set the direction and priorities for the Archdiocese. Right now our church seems as divided as our country and that is unfortunate. There is a tendency to walk away or not speak up, particularly if we don't think our voice matters. I believe our voices do matter, but no one can hear us unless we actually say something. The listening sessions give us an opportunity to do just that and hopefully everyone is able to attend at least one of them:

There is a lot of emphasis on prayer/adoration as well as justice/outreach. Both are good and necessary but prayer that doesn't include justice, and justice that doesn't include prayer are incomplete. Who we are and what we do as Church ought to have an impact on who we are and what we do as a society.

St. Cecilia's has a good balance between the two – all the more reason for our voices to be heard.
