Herbert A. H. Bittner, 86, of Harbor Beach and long time Elkton native, died Tuesday evening, Sept. 24, 2002, at Tendercare in Cass City. Surviving are his wife of 65 years, Marietta; his daughter, Joan Hanson and her husband, AI, of Grindstone; four sons, Ron Bittner and his wife, Carol, of Bridgeport, Jerry Bittner and his wife, Crystal, of Anchorage, Alaska, Bill Bittner and his wife, Diana, of Elkton, and Jim Bittner of Carlsbad, Calif.: 15 grandchildren, Cindy, Kelly, Roxanne, Peggy, Stacy, Ron, Norm, Amy, Steve, Chris, David, Deidra, Dan, Ryan, and Randi; 21 great-grandchildren; his sister, Ina Holcomb of Augusta, Ga; a brother, Arnold Bittner of Saginaw; and many nieces and nephews.
