2021 State Session

If you haven't heard, Berks County along with Bucks, Chester, Dauphin, Lancaster, Lebanon, and Montgomery counties will be hosting the 2021 State Session. A letter will be sent to all participating 6 Pomona and 33 Community Granges. Our next committee meeting will be Sunday, March 10, 2019 at the Gouglersville Grange at 2PM. I am asking that each Grange have at least 1 representative attend so that every Grange is represented. The 2021 State Grange session will be at the Clarion Hotel in Exton, PA.

It was decided at our last meeting, that we are asking for \$500 from each grange within the hosting region. It was suggested that each Pomona figure a way to raise the amount that will be needed. Berks County needs to raise \$5500 total. It was suggested that our Pomona will provide \$2750 to start, and each Grange is being requested to donate \$1/member or more at this time. AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

This week I attended a listening session with other Grangers and representatives of the State Budget and Finance Committee. You may remember our own Judy Schwank commissioned a study to look into problems facing the PA dairy industry, and these folks came to the Grange to get input from farmers. I was impressed by their understanding of the complexity of milk pricing and other issues like regulation, product innovation, and supply/demand. Although there are no quick fixes, I am optimistic that we can improve what we have.

Some key takeaways from our meeting:

The milk marketing board is a benefit to the state's small processors since they get a level of price assurance as well.

You won't see milk getting gouged at 99 cents a gallon in PA as long as our pricing decisions are made in Harrisburg and not Bentonville. Arkansas.

Product innovation/diversification is necessary to drive consumption but we need to make sure there's a market for specific products first.

I do hope you will seek information from your secretary on what is in the P.C./Lecturer area and start to work on projects for the 2019 annual State Session. You can also retrieve the information on the PA State Grange web-site (www.pagrange.org) under the P.C./Lecturer area. Specific contests within the P.C./Lecturer area consist of the following: Container Pot Decorating, Tissue Box Covers, Craft Stick Art, Wreaths, and My Favorite Anything, Pen in Hand, Art and Photography. A number of the contests have both Junior and Subordinate divisions. The only areas that will need subordinate judging is the photography contest categories. You can also contact me for further information.

The Mid-Atlantic Leader's Conference (which includes P.C./Lecturers) will take place on March 15-16-17, 2019 in the Gettysburg area. More information will be posted on the PA State Grange website in the near future. I do hope Berks County will have representation at this conference. In fact, this conference is not only for P.C./Lecturers, it is for all leaders in the Grange, or anyone else who would desire to learn about the activities and leadership in the Grange program. The Youth Department within our Grange organization will be providing the program, and conducting the meeting, for the March 2 meeting. I do hope our membership will come out to the meeting at Bernville Grange to witness their involvement in our Grange program.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES DEPARTMENT – Substitute, Nettie A. Kauffman

As with many of the various departments throughout the Grange program, the Family Activities department is starting with some new programs and projects in this department. Information on the contests and projects on the PA State Grange level were distributed to the various Subordinate Granges who attended the pre-quarterly meeting in November. If you have not heard anything about these contests, please contact your F.A. chairperson, or you can contact your Secretary who has received the complete booklet on all contests for the 2019 Grange year. Another way to seek this information is to go to the PA State Grange web-site (www.pagrange.org) and click on the Family Activities department to seek this information.

Three new contests have been added to the F.A. area for 2019. Table Centerpieces is one area with Class 19 being with a candle; Class 20 is made with coffee/soup mug; and Class 21 will be Holiday of your choice. Maximum size is 8" x 8", any shape is acceptable. The second new contest is Mosaic Artwork – Class 22 is any medium (glass beads, small tile, etc. Maximum size is 12" x 12". No kits are allowed. The third contest is a Shadow Box. The categories in this area are: Class 23 Vacation; Class 24 Holiday; Class 25 Sports and Class 26 Other. Maximum size is 15" long x 12" wide x 2" deep. Any shape is acceptable, within maximum size. No kits are allowed. You must first create and make your shadow box and then put items on the shelves to depict one of the categories. I spoke with the State F.A. Director and she indicated the particular items in each category must be included when judging. They should be placed in a plastic bag with a diagram of how the placements should appear at time of judging. The items will be placed in the appropriate spaces at time of judging by the committees involved with F.A. department. A cellophane covering will be placed over the shadow box at the state level of judging to protect your items from little fingers!

Please consider doing some of the F.A. projects which are basically the same in the quilt, and needlework areas as in previous years. The Baking contest will be: Class 10 – Cherry Pie (whole pie, 9" pan/tin); Class 11 – Chocolate Chip Cookies (6 cookies on a paper plate); and Class 13 Haystack Candy (6 pieces on a paper plate). All first place entries judged at the Subordinate level will advance to the county level of judging. Judging on the county level for baking will be held on August 19. Needlework judging will be held September 7 at the regular county meeting.

The Quilt Block contest diagrams have also been provided to the Subordinate F.A. directors. The title of the Block is "Kelly's Colors." One would use the colors that coincide with the various entities within the Grange (Royal Blue print for

Subordinate; Dark Green solid for Pomona; Pink solid for State; and Gold Yellow solid for

National). If you need a pattern to follow, please contact your Subordinate F.A. Director; or you can contact me at 610-926-5389.

It would be great to see a large quantity of entries in both the Baking area and Needlework/creative project areas. Remember, the Berks County F.A. Department provides monetary prizes of 1^{st} - \$15, 2^{nd} - \$12, and 3^{rd} - \$10.
