



#### Stages of Human Life - Month 2

"I'm dancing!" The baby is making rapid progress developing all her/his external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form and her fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips, and tongue can now be clearly seen. Even her/his brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervious system is now functioning and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercise. By the number 8 weeks all body systems are present and the baby is called a "fetus", a latin word meaning "little one" or "young one." On Sunday, February 24, the 37 diocesan deacon candidates were instituted acolytes by Bishop Ronald Gainer. The General Instruction on the Roman Missal (GIRM) states "The acolyte is instituted for service at the altar and to assist the Priest and Deacon. It is his place principally to prepare the altar and the sacred vessels and, if necessary, to distribute the Eucharist to the faithful as an extraordinary minister." The acolyte may also purify the sacred vessels. While many of these services may be shared by other laypersons, the acolyte bears a particular responsibility to the ministry at the altar. Bishop Gainer and the diaconal formators request that all the Faithful of the Diocese welcome the ministry of our new acolytes and pray for them and their families as they continue their discernment and their formation for ordination.
