Brenda Jones delivered our Inspiration for the day.



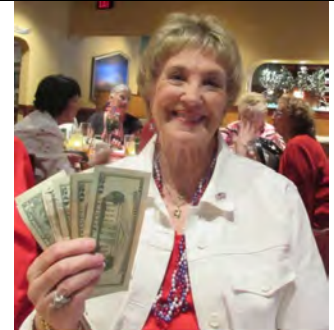
