Pay 2022/23

Derbyshire UNISON has just received a pay offer which has been emailed out to members for a quick consultation. Returns are needed by 9pm on Wednesday 29 June.



emh Care & Support members balloted over pay

The pay offer sees proposed pay increases of between 3.4% for registered nurses, to bring them in line with the NHS, and 6.7% for residential support workers.

Area organiser Dave Gorton said:

"In times of hardship, the likes of which many members will not have experienced before, any rise which doesn't match the rate of inflation is insufficient.

"Sadly, the state of the social care sector means our members in emh, where we have a recognition agreement and good trade union density, will be 'ahead of the game' just through this rise.

"Most members in other organisations will receive nothing, unless an increase was forced on the employer to avoid falling below the legal minimum wage.

"It is still a huge cause of concern that this rise will still see the majority of members paid less than £10/hr.

"UNISON will respond appropriately to the membership vote but I have to say we are unlikely to increase the offer by negotiation alone."
