The New Year is well underway, but all of us at Turning Points would like to offer you our wishes for a happy and blessed 2016! We feel blessed to be able to provide the level of assistance that many in our community need—help with housing, transportation, child care, and basic necessities that most of us take for granted on a daily basis! We could not do what is needed here without your support – so THANK YOU!

While the political community highlights the low employment rate that Manatee County and the State of Florida has, those statistics do not tell a complete story. Many of our clients hold down two jobs as they try to make ends meet in their households, yet still struggle to pay all their bills. Although our economy is improving, we are still waiting for wages to increase for service workers, and as long and the service based economy in our country maintains wages at their current level we will continue to see people in need of housing, food and other basic necessities. As you are probably aware, up to 13% of our fellow community members live in poverty, while another 30% are working but at risk of homelessness and/or sinking into poverty.

To meet the need of these people, we continue our programs which are designated to meet the needs that people come to us asking for most often. One of these is access to dental care, and we are very excited to announce that with the addition of the dental room made possible by the Bradenton Kiwanis, we are now able to operate with two dentists/dental assistants, enabling us to almost double the number of clients who previously could be seen! We are planning to expand access even further if one of our grant applications comes through, providing another full service room! We are also looking for a 20 hour a week Florida licensed physician to provide services and be our medical director for our clinic. If you know of anyone who may be interested, please send them our way! As always, the best way to understand what we do is to take a tour – so come on by any day between 8:30 and 5:00 and we will be happy to show you what a difference Turning Points makes with your help!

Coach's Note

Our Christmas season of giving started Saturday December 19th with Gloria Dei Lutheran Church giving out toys, underwear and socks. Sunday was blankets, gloves and hats. Monday we give out fresh fruit, oranges and apples and a beverage. Tuesday we gave out T-Shirts and toiletry bags. Wednesday we gave out hoodie sweatshirts. Christmas Eve everything leftover and plus twelve small bikes. Thank you to the directors and others who helped out with this special program. As with our lunch program the joy is in the giving to our brothers and sisters in need at this special time of year, join us next year by calling Penny at 745-2992.

Our Annual Report on Meals Served is included in this newsletter, our monthly totals were down in the beginning of the year when Downtown Ministry started serving a breakfast meal on Saturday and Sundays but by year end our totals were back to normal. Annual Hours served by volunteers were up in Loaves & Fishes but down in the dining room.

Our Annual Report on Receipts and Disbursements is included. On the receipts side it always amazes me with all the amounts coming in during the year that at year-end it looks the same as last year. Our receipts from Civic Organizations and Corporations was over budget because of a donation from Mosaic, individual donations were up thank you all, we also were the beneficiary of two estates during the year.

Our expenses were up due to the food items we are purchasing both for Loaves & Fishes and the kitchen. We are now using \$2500 per month purchases in the grocery store which given to over 1000 families a month. Our purchases include canned foods, rice and beans, produce items, cereals and other food items. Last year we applied for several grants to help us fund these purchases, but none were granted. We will try again this year to find help in funding this program.

Since we started in 1984 most of the food items we used in the kitchen were provided by grocery stores, restaurants and Meals on Wheels. Our pickups since we lost Sweetbay and others have dropped off so much that we are now purchasing \$1500 per month for the kitchen use. Between the two our budget has increased \$50,000 or 25% in the last two years. All other expenses are in line with last year and the budget. On the bottom are our non-budget items. Receipts from Estates and Investments are not included because we do not know in advance how the year will turn out. Same for the outreach items-our general policy is if we have funds available we help where needed. Most of the outreach requests come to us thru Turning Point. Depreciations expense is a non-cash item, writing off our equipment purchase in the new building.

Overall we are very blessed and with your help we can continue feeding the hungry in 2016. -- Bob Eikill
