


<u>CONVERSATIONS AROUND DEATH & DYING (MAiD)</u> One theme arising from previous sessions on MAiD was that many of us are uncomfortable discussing our own death as well as the death of a loved one. However, honest conversations (about values, good palliative care, or advanced care planning) can help to improve the care we receive at the end of our lives. In response to this, the Committee Looking at Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) is planning a session for **Monday, November 21st at Holy Family (Falkland Street, Moncton) from 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm**. The



session will be led by Pam Driedger, member of the Adult Faith Commission and a Director of Spiritual Care at the Moncton Hospital with Horizon Health Network. The aim of this session will be to help families start conversations about death and dying before circumstances force them to. How can families and loved ones accompany those who find themselves struggling with illness, pain and difficult medical circumstances? FOR OUR COMMON HOME OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS

Pope Francis invites us to a profound conversion. To care for our world, our brothers and sisters and our children and all future generations. We as the Archdiocese of Moncton, are undertaking to explore our Holy Father's encyclical letter, and commit to making the changes necessary to bring them about.

We, at the combined parishes of Queen of All Saints, will welcome Sister Denise Lirette at next weekend's masses as she will help us to organize and support us as we make this journey. One of the ways we will work to study the document will be to offer excerpts from the document, with a brief commentary for reflection.

We encourage, we plead, we beg you to read the document. It can easily and freely be found online. Let us begin by looking at the concerns our previous Pope's have had concerning our environment. It has been over 50 years since Pope Paul VI spoke on this topic.

- "4. In 1971, eight years after <u>Pacem in Terris</u>, <u>Blessed Pope Paul VI</u> referred to the ecological concern as "a tragic consequence" of unchecked human activity: "Due to an ill-considered exploitation of nature, humanity runs the risk of destroying it and becoming in turn a victim of this degradation".[2] He spoke in similar terms to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations about the potential for an "ecological catastrophe under the effective explosion of industrial civilization", and stressed "the urgent need for a radical change in the conduct of humanity", inasmuch as "the most extraordinary scientific advances, the most amazing technical abilities, the most astonishing economic growth, unless they are accompanied by authentic social and moral progress, will definitively turn against man".[3]
- 5. Saint John Paul II became increasingly concerned about this issue. In his first Encyclical he warned that human beings frequently seem "to see no other meaning in their natural environment than what serves for immediate use and consumption".[4] Subsequently, he would call for a global ecological conversion.[5] At the same time, he noted that little effort had been made to "safeguard the moral conditions for an authentic human ecology".[6] The destruction of the human environment is extremely serious, not only because God has entrusted the world to us men and women, but because human life is itself a gift which must be defended from various forms of debasement. Every effort to protect and improve our world entails profound changes in "lifestyles, models of production and consumption, and the established structures of power which today govern societies".[7] Authentic human development has a moral character. It presumes full respect for the human person, but it must also be concerned for the world around us and "take into account the nature of each being and of its mutual connection in an ordered system".[8] Accordingly, our human ability to transform reality must proceed in line with God's original gift of all that is.[9]






