

UPCOMING DAY TRIPS!!

<u>Snooty Fox shopping trip!!</u> - Friday, May 5th. We will leave the Center promptly at 8:45 a.m. and return around 6 p.m. Lunch will be on your own at our Hyde Park stop.

<u>Blooms & Butterflies at Franklin Park Conservatory</u>—Tuesday, May 16th. This trip will leave at 9:00 a.m. Trip fee is \$20 which includes admission and van fare. Lunch will be on your own at the Garden Café in the Conservatory.

May Mystery Lunch—Thursday, May 18th. We will leave the Center at 10:30 a.m. Trip fee is \$5.

<u>Kingwood Gardens and Ohio Reformatory Tour</u>—Thursday, June 15th. Trip fee is \$96. which includes entry fees, motor coach and lunch. Driver tip not included. Deadline to pay is May 12th. No refunds after this date.

We will leave the Center at 8:45 a.m. Our first stop will be at the Kingwood Gardens for a self guided tour of the beautiful flower gardens and the mansion. Lunch will be in the Gateway Café and will include pulled pork, bbq pulled chicken, macaroni & cheese, beans, cole slaw, and frosted brownies. We will leave Kingwood no later than 12:15 p.m.

Our next stop will be at the Ohio State Reformatory also known as the Mansfield Reformatory, is a historic prison located in Mansfield, Ohio in the United States. It was built between 1886 and 1910 and remained in operation until 1990. This is where much of the movie Shawshank Redemption was filmed.

We will be doing a self guided tour with a listening device for each person. Newly installed elevators will make our visit much more enjoyable. It takes 1 1/2 to 2 hours to do the self guided tour. We plan to leave the Reformatory about 2:45 p.m. As we leave Mansfield we will be making a stop at Whit's Frozen Custard for ice cream or a snack (on your own).

<u>June Mystery Lunch and short tour</u>—Thursday, June 22nd. This trip will leave the Center at 9:30 a.m. Trip fee is \$10 which is your van fee and tour fee.

Rock and Roll Hall of Fame—Wednesday, September 20th. Trip fee is \$70 due by August 1st. No refunds after this date. Your fee includes motor coach transportation and your admission. *Driver tip not included*. This trip will leave the Center at 7:30 a.m. We will be making a quick stop on the way at a McDonald's or similar for a rest break and you can purchase food if you are hungry. We plan to make it to the Hall of Fame by 10:30 depending on traffic, etc. Lunch will be on your own at the All Access Café in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. You should have about 3 to 3 1/2 hours for lunch and to tour the museum. We plan to leave at 2:00 p.m. A rest stop will also be made on the way back to London.

Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA—If you are 70 1/2 or older and have an IRA, you know that each year you must take your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). But did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. Easy Banana Pancakes for Two

1/2 c. flour

1 1/2 tsp. sugar



1 tsp. baking powder

1/8 tsp. salt

1 medium to large very ripe banana

1 large egg

2-3 tbsp. milk

1 tbsp. vegetable oil or melted butter

1/2 tsp. vanilla

In a small bowl, whisk together flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt.

In a medium bowl, use a fork or potato masher to mash peeled banana very well. Add egg, 2 tbsp. milk, oil, and vanilla, and mix until well combined.

Add flour mixture and use a spoon to stir until just combined. If batter seems too thick, add up to 1 tbsp. more milk.

Heat a griddle to 350 degrees or a skillet over medium heat (no higher). Once cooking surface is hot, lightly grease with butter or cooking spray and add pancake batter using a 1/3 cup. Cook first side until the tops of the pancakes begin to bubble. Flip and cook until cooked through.
