

Blessing of Throats

We will have blessing of throats in honor of Saint Blaise next Friday, February 3rd after the 8 a.m. Mass and next weekend, February 4th and 5th, after all the Masses. Saint Blaise was a doctor as well as a bishop in Armenia during the fourth century. It is believed that Blaise once healed a boy who was choking on a fish bone. Because of that, he is the patron of the sick, especially people with illnesses of the throat. It is an ancient custom to pray for good health with a blessing of throats on his feast day.



Blessing of Candles/Candlemas

On Thursday, February 2, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast occurs 40 days after Christmas. Simeon recognized Christ as the Messiah and referred to Him as the "Light of revelation to the nations." On the Feast of the Presentation, candles are traditionally blessed for use in the Church and in the home. The blessed candles will be available for purchase for those who are interested. The donation for a box of two 8 inch candles is \$4; Votive candles (all colors) are \$3. Parishioners are also invited to bring candles from home to be blessed.

Stewardship Reflections

Many think the Sermon on the Mount is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. It tells us how we are to live our lives and the attitudes we are to have. Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of Who He is. He begins the Beatitudes (meaning "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense we are all "poor in spirit." We must have the guidance and strength provided to us by the Lord to live in the poverty of spirit, a spirituality of simplicity.

Living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ is being a steward of our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. The first Christians were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed. Are you truly living with His message in your heart? Saint Benedict School Registration

Saint Benedict School will accept registrations for the 2023-2024 academic year the week of February 5th. Children may be enrolled for the Pre-kindergarten 3 and Pre-kindergarten 4 programs, which include religious education and a curriculum that readies pupils for success in Kindergarten. The PK3 program offers classes on Tuesday and Thursday, while the PK4 program offers 3 different options for scheduling. Children may also be enrolled for all-day kindergarten and grades 1 through 8.

Children must be three or four years old, respectively, for prekindergarten, five years old for kindergarten, and six years old for first grade by August 31, 2023. Children being enrolled in kindergarten should accompany their parent to Saint Benedict School on the day of registration. A birth certificate, social security card, immunization record, Baptismal certificate, and a \$40 non-refundable fee must be provided at the time of registration. Please contact the School Office at 814-344-6512 to obtain enrollment forms and to schedule an appointment to register your child.
