
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#### WARREN COUNTY AGRICULTURAL FAIR

#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

- 1. The 2022 Fair will begin on Saturday, July 16 and end on Saturday, July 23.
- 2. The Fair Board reserves the right to postpone the time of exhibitions of any class, article or animal on account of bad weather, or for any other good and sufficient reason.
- 3. All livestock showing in the Jr. Show must be on the fairgrounds by 6 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20 and will be released at the conclusion of the Jr. Steer Show.
- 4. Only two entries per class by an exhibitor unless otherwise limited by department.
- All classes with less than five entries will be combined whenever possible at the decision of Department Superintendent.
- 6. Exhibitors must be able to prove ownership of entries for thirty days prior to show.
- All breeding stock must be registered in the name of the exhibitor. All animals must meet health requirements of the livestock exhibition rules. Health and registration papers are due at the time of weigh-in. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- 8. All livestock entered in the Junior Shows and the 4-H Show must pay stall or pen fees. Stall and pen fees will be \$5.00 per head for all cattle and \$7.00 per pen for all swine, sheep & goats. Limit of 4 animals to a pen.
- 9. All entries must be accompanied by payment for Stall and Pen fees. **DO NOT SEND ENTRY FEES.**
- All entries MUST be in the Secretary's hands by Friday, July 8.

- 11. No animal is to occupy a stall or pen on the grounds of the Fair Association unless competing for a premium, or there as a nurse animal for others that are competing and then the regular stall or pen fee must be paid for such animal
- 12. **ABSOLUTELY NO** exhibitor to stay overnight at the fair-grounds. These rules will be enforced. Security will check on animals and the fairgrounds during this period.
- 13. All animals must be exhibited in the show ring by the owner unless special permission is granted by the Department Superintendent.

- ABSOLUTELY NO marking pens or bedding pens before NOON, Tuesday. This will be enforced.
- 15. Washing facilities will be available on the grounds.
- Please hold bedding to a "reasonable amount" because of the fire hazard.
- 17. The Junior Livestock Divisions are open to boys and girls who are a minimum age of 8 years of age as of September 1 of the prior year. Individuals that are under 21 years of age as of September 1 of the prior year may participate in the Junior Livestock Division provided they are active FFA members. (Please refer to the Illinois Sate Fair Livestock General Rules https://www2.illinois.gov/statefair/competitions/premium-books/Documents/livestock.pdf). Group placings are not permitted. Animals shown in Junior Shows must be property of the boys or girls showing them. (This may be proven by examining the registration certificates.)
- 18. Departments A, F, G, H, K, L, M, O, P and U are open to all counties.
- 19. Every animal or article exhibited on the grounds shall be under control of the Superintendent of its class; and no article or animal shall be removed from the Fair Grounds without permission of the livestock superintendent.
- 20. Care will be taken to prevent loss or injury to animals or articles on exhibition, but the Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. No animal will be allowed to run at large on the grounds.
- 21. In case of a dispute over which class the animal is to be shown, the Superintendent's decision is final.
- 22. Neck straps required on all cattle.
- 23. All animals must be washed.
- 24. Premium checks may be picked up at the fair office on Saturday, July 23, after 6:00 p.m. If you can not make it at this time please call (309) 368-6549 to make other arrangements. If you would like your check mailed to you, you must bring a self-addressed stamped envelope to the Fair Office the day of your event.
- The Warren County Fair Board is not responsible for accidents or omissions.
- 26. Any decision made by the Warren County Fair Board is final.
