THE JOURNEY OF A LIFETIME

In February of 2002, Joanne and I were set to lead a trip to the Holy Land. Then...911 happened. What seemed like the chance of a lifetime suddenly seemed like a very bad idea. The trip was cancelled and the opportunity never arose again. Until now! In January of 2018, we will again get the chance to lead a trip to the Holy Land. And WHAT a trip it will be- it will focus on following the path of Jesus' life, from Bethlehem all the way to the Garden Tomb.

We will fly out of St. Louis on Jan. 8, 2018, landing in Tel Aviv on the 9th. That night, we will stay in a hotel in Bethlehem. On the 10th, we will explore one of the most exciting archeological digs in Israel- the Herodion, the palace fortress and final resting place of Herod the Great. Then it's on to Bethlehem, where we will visit the cave where Jesus was born, the Church of the Nativity and the Shepherds' Field, where angels first proclaimed the Good News.

On the 11th, we will visit Tel Megiddo (the Biblical site of Armageddon), Sephoris (the cosmopolitan Roman capital of Galilee), Nazareth (Jesus' boyhood home) before remembering wedding vows at the Franciscan Wedding Chapel in Cana (the site of Jesus' first miracle). On the 12th, we will visit the Valley of the Doves, Magdala, Capernaum and the traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000 before having worship on a boat on the Sea of Galilee. We will spend the night in Galilee.

On the 13th, it's on to Northern Israel- Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights and the Mount of Beatitudes before remembering our baptism at the Jordan River. On the 14th, we will tour Beit Shean, Qumran (where the Dead Sea scrolls were found) and the Mount of Olives before going on the Palm Sunday Walk, ending in the Garden of Gethsemane. On the 15th, it's into Jerusalem to see the Emek Tzurim (the Temple Sifting Project), the Gihon Spring, Hezekiah's Tunnel, the Pool of Siloam and the Southern Steps of the Temple. We will end the day with a visit to Mt. Zion and stand in the Upper Room.

On the 16th, it's on to morning prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane and the Kidron Valley before walking the Via Dolorosa (the path Jesus walked to the cross). We will also visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and take Communion at the Garden Tomb, where the Resurrection happened. On the 17th, we fly back into St. Louis.

Bethlehem. Nazareth. Jerusalem. The Upper Room. The Garden of Gethsemane. The Garden Tomb. Renewing wedding vows in Cana of Galilee. Worship on the Sea of Galilee. Remembering baptisms at the Jordan River. Communion at the Garden Tomb. It's hard to even wrap your head around. To say that Joanne and I are excited about this trip is a GROSS understatement! And the possibility of taking this trip with our church family makes it that much better!

The New Testament story of the Prodigal Son is one of the best known, most scrutinized stories in the Bible. But at its heart...what is the story REALLY about? Who IS the Prodigal? And what does it have to tell us about life in 21st Century America?

In January and February, we will ask all of those questions- and many more- as we take **The Long Journey Home**. Each week, we will focus on one or two verses from the Prodigal Son story- unpacking it to see what is underneath and, more importantly, what it has to say to us. The weeks of the series look like this:

Be careful what you ask for. (Malachi 3:10, Romans 12:2)

Sunday, January 15, 2017- Devastating (Luke 15:14-16)

Sometimes, the hole is so deep...it's hard to see the top. (Psalm 34:17-20, 2Corinthians 4:8-9)

Sunday, January 22, 2017- Longing (Luke 15:17-20a)

Repentance is a difficult task. Psalm 63:1-3, John 3:16-17)

Sunday, January 29, 2017- Confessing (Luke 15:20b-21)

Sometimes, the way up...is down. (Isaiah 53:5, 1John 1:9)

Sunday, February 5, 2017- Celebrating (Luke 15:22-24)

Reunited...and it feels so good! (Psalm 150, Philippians 4:4)

Sunday, February 12, 2017- Realizing (Luke 15:25-27)

Sometimes, the truth is hard to hear. (Proverbs 18:2, Colossians 4:6)

Sunday, February 19, 2017- Accusing (Luke 15:28-30)

Jealousy often leads to pain. (Isaiah 53:7, Jude 1:3)

Sunday, February 26, 2017- Reconciling (Luke 15:31-32)

Though the sorrow may last for the night, the joy comes in the morning! (Psalm 34:8, Ephesians 4:32)

Come each week expecting God to show up in powerful ways!

Have you noticed how busy the church is these days? Our custodians tells me that they are having an increasingly difficult time even finding opportunities to clean because there are ALWAYS folks in the building! That is a GREAT thing! And it's great because we not simply busy for the sake of being busy. Instead, we are busy connecting people to Jesus Christ. It's the yardstick by which we measure everything we do here. As the number of ministries grows, so does the need for funding. A church that averages 280 people each Sunday in worship and continues to add a great many new ministries has a higher budget than a church that doesn't do those things.

The membership vows of the United Methodist Church challenge us to support the church through our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. And I would argue that those are ALL important...not just the "gifts" part. The church works at its best when we lift it up through our prayers, through our presence (literally being here), our gifts (both monetary and otherwise), our service (rolling up our sleeves and being about God's business) and our witness (sharing with others the difference God has made in our lives).

In late December, you should have received a packet in the mail- a letter encouraging you to pray about your financial support of the church in 2017. I would encourage you to do just that- pray about it. Ask God how He is calling you to support your church this year. Then, on Sunday, January 15 at all 3 worship services, we will all be invited to come forward and offer our commitment to God. Great things are happening at AUMC- I'm excited to see where God takes us next! Will you join me?



CONNECTION COINS FOR JANUARY

The Connection Coins (or as Rev. Mark calls them, the “thinly-veiled Pringles cans”!) are doing great things in the life of the Aledo UMC! I HAVE A DREAM

On Monday, January 16th, we celebrate the anniversary of the birth of slain civil rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. For our kids, it's a day off from school. My experience is that for many of them, that's all it is. Why DO we celebrate this man's birthday?

Although he is often labeled as simply an advocate of African-American rights, Dr. King's message truly transcended any notion of merely being a spokesman for a particular group. His was NOT simply a message of race and color; his was a message of hope- grounded in strong Biblical principles. When he delivered what was arguably his most famous speech, he said, "I have a dream." His dream was NOT that we would let ethnicity separate us. His dream was NOT that people of a particular skin color would strike out against those of another color. His dream was NOT that children would learn to hate others because of their physical appearance. His dream was that ALL people could live together in peace and harmony, regardless of the color of their skin. When that glorious day happened, he said, we would be able to quote the old spiritual and exclaim, "Free at last. Free at last. Thank God Almighty, we are free at last!"

We are all unique and we are all different. That's NOT our weakness- it's our strength! Our diversity makes us strong. We are all children of God- made in His image. This month, take a moment and reflect on Dr. King. Tell your kids or grandkids about him. My prayer is his prayer- that one day we will live in a world where people aren't judged by the color of their skin, but the content of their heart.

JANUARY- A SEASON OF PRAYER AND FASTING

A great thing will happen in January! On Sunday, January 1st, we will begin a 2-week period of prayer and fasting. Everybody in the church will be encouraged to participate as God leads you.
