

Miss Ida A. Craft, 294 Stuyvesant avenue, Suffrage leader of Fifth Assembly District, will leave town on Monday for a two weeks trip up the state. She was to have spoken on Saturday night at the corner of Reid and Greene avenues, but owing to the bad weather the meeting was called off. On last Tuesday night the little "Col." spoke at Union Square, Manhattan, under the auspices of the Woman's Suffrage Party, she is always actively engaged getting votes for the cause and the trip of two weeks or more she is about to take means every day speech-making. When she addressed the scholars last week at Kaplan School on Pitkin avenue, three hundred pupils ranging in age from 15 to 18 years were visibly impressed with the reasons she gave why women should vote. To give a glimpse of her strenuous work, on last Wednesday she spoke from each of the platforms of the Woman's Suffrage co-operative meeting under the auspices of the Woman's Suffrage Party, Woman's Political Union and Kings County Woman's Suffrage Association. She says, "Fall promises to be one of the most active times in the history of the suffrage organization." She also prophesies that "the suffragists will lead the "anti's" such a strenuous life that during the winter the "antis," being the weaker sex, will end the season by suffering from nervous prostration." There is plenty of work ahead for the "Col." and—she is equal to it.
