Further Changes to Paediatric First Aid Training (Sorry!)

This seems to be a recurring theme in our newsletters- & here we go again!

As you may be aware, the **Department for Education** (DfE) has never specified a syllabus for paediatric first aid courses for the **Early Years Foundation Stage** (EYFS). However, following extensive consultation with key stakeholders in the industry, the DfE has published a course syllabus for both the full paediatric first aid course and the emergency paediatric first aid course.

In line with these changes, the First Aid Awarding Organisations Forum have been liaising with the DfE to write new units for the regulated paediatric and emergency paediatric first aid qualifications.

These new units have now been agreed and **approved by the DfE** as meeting both current and new requirements.

As such, on the 1st January 2017 the current regulated Paediatric and Emergency Paediatric first aid qualifications(QCF) will be replaced by the new **Level 3 Award in Paediatric First Aid (RQF)** & Level 3 Award in Emergency Paediatric First Aid (RQF) qualifications (please note that-all current certificates held by staff will be valid until their expiry date)

Changes Include

- All delegates will be assessed on using the AED as part of their CPR Practical Training
- There is now much less emphasis on the reporting of incidents.
- Minor injuries and bites and stings have now moved to the Emergency Paediatric First Aid unit
- Fractures, dislocations, sprains and strains" are not individually covered.
- Assessment criteria on "concussion, skull fracture and cerebral compression" have been simplified to "head injuries". This reflects concern on a first aider's ability to accurately differentiate between the conditions.
- Sickle cell crisis has been removed from the assessment criteria.

Despite these changes- our trainers will still be able to include more detail about any topic or subject-whether it is in the syllabus-or not!

'What to do if a child in your class has a convulsive seizure'

EPILEPSY FIRST AID

- 1. Stay calm.
- 2. **Look around** is the person in a dangerous place? If not, don't move them. Move objects like furniture away from them.
- 3. **Note the time** the seizure starts.
- 4. **Stay with them**. If they don't collapse but seem blank or confused, gently guide them away from any danger. Speak quietly and calmly.
- 5. **Cushion their head** with something soft if they have collapsed to the ground.
- 6. **Don't hold them down**.
- 7. **Don't put anything in their mouth.**
- 8. **Check the time again.** If a convulsive (shaking) seizure doesn't stop after 5 minutes, call for an ambulance (dial 999).
- 9. **After the seizure has stopped**, <u>put them into the recovery position</u> and check that their breathing is returning to normal. Gently check their mouth to see that nothing is blocking their airway such as food . If their breathing sounds difficult after the seizure has stopped, call for an ambulance.
- 10. Stay with them until they are fully recovered.

If they are injured, or they have another seizure without recovering fully from the first seizure, call for an ambulance. (advice from the Epilepsy Society 2016)
