### Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit

Luke 6:43-45



BIBLE BACKGROUND

### Jesus Compares Trees to Authentic Faith

In his references to good and bad trees in this passage, Jesus is obviously drawing an analogy to the fruit that people bear. Notice that the distinction is not between healthy apple trees and diseased apple trees. It is between fruit trees and thorns or briers; it is the kind of tree that makes the difference. Many kinds of trees look good but don't produce fruit. So it is with people. Jesus seems to be saying that a person who is not really a servant of God, no matter how good he or she seems to be, cannot possibly produce fruit for him. Conversely, someone who really is God's servant will automatically produce fruit.

### The Heart Is Known Through Actions

Then in Luke 6:45, Jesus expounds on the principle he introduced in the tree metaphor. What comes out of us through our speech and behavior flows from what is within. If what is inside us is good and God-honoring, our lives will honor God. If what is inside us is evil, our lives will not honor God. No matter how hard we try to make good impressions, no one will be fooled for long if our hearts are deceitful.

### The Jesus Connection

As we make our relationship with Jesus a priority, we'll find our actions will bear fruit that will please him.

Read aloud Luke 6:43-45. What can you do to store good things in your heart? In what circumstances can you bring good things out of the good you've stored in your heart? If you passionately follow God, the good you've stored will flow out to a needy world. Ask God to show you someone in your church who has a need. And then do the good thing and help that person.

### **Yummy Apples**

### What You'll Do

Place the teaching picture on the floor, and then gather one or two toddlers near you. Open the Bible to Luke 6:43-45.

Say: The Bible says that God made all kinds of wonderful trees for us to enjoy! This is an apple tree. Let's see what happens to an apple tree. Play "Apple Tree Sounds" (track 3). As the CD segment plays, say: The apple tree sways in the gentle breeze. Can you raise your arms and sway in the breeze? God sends birds to the tree to make their nests. Can you flap your arms like a bird? The birds say, "Thank you, God, for our homes in the trees." God makes fruit grow on the tree! At the sound of each apple growing, place a felt circle on the tree. Turn off the CD after the sixth "boing" sound.

Look at the big, juicy apples on that tree! God helps the apple tree to grow apples. God helps you grow, too. Show me how God is helping you grow tall. Stretch up high! Show me how God is helping you grow strong. Show me your muscles! Show me how God is helping you grow to be more loving. Give me a hug! God is helping you grow! FOD HELPS US GROW!



### **Fruit Bracelets**


#### What You'll Do

Wrap a loop of masking tape, sticky side out, on each toddler's wrist.

Say: God is helping you grow each day! You're learning to be kind and loving. God is helping you learn to help and share. 

GOD HELPS US GROW. Talk about other positive things you've noticed about each child. Press one piece of fruit-flavored cereal on the masking tape for each attribute you mention.

Look how your bracelets have grown! You have lots of good fruit. Throughout class point out the good fruit on each child's bracelet. God helps [child's name] grow good fruit. The tape may be torn or carefully cut off children's wrists.

### Like Good Fruit

### What You'll Do

Place the teaching picture on the floor near you. Gather the 2-year-olds.

Say: God made all kinds of wonderful trees for us to enjoy! This is an apple tree. Let's see what happens to an apple tree. Turn on the CD. As the CD segment plays, say: The apple tree sways in the gentle breeze. Can you raise your arms and sway in the breeze? God sends birds to the tree to make their nests. Can you flap your arms like a bird? The birds say, "Thank you, God, for our homes in the trees." God makes fruit grow on the tree! At the sound of each apple growing, place one of the red felt circles on the tree. Have the twos jump each time they hear a "boing" sound.

Soon someone will come to pick the delicious apples. The person will climb a ladder. Climb up! Let's pick the apples. Hear them fall into the basket? Let's climb down so the birds won't be frightened. Now let's sit under the apple tree and rest. Listen to the sound of rustling leaves until the end of the track.

Ask:

What do you think the farmer would do if the apples looked like this?

Hang the gray felt circles in place of the red. Say: These apples don't look good to eat. If all the apples looked like this, the farmer might cut the tree down and plant another one that would grow yummy apples.

Open your Bible to Luke 6:43-45.

Say: Jesus told us that God wants to help us be like the tree that grows good fruit, not like the tree that grows yucky apples. Our fruit is love, kindness, joy, and other good things.

Spring Quarter

Lesson 1

Infants, Toddlers & 2s



Say: God is growing good things inside you that others will someday see. Let's print some fruit hearts on these children to remember that ▶ GOD HELPS US GROW. Help each child press the apple half on the sponge and then between the head and feet of each child on the handout.

Ask:





### Jesus Tells the Parable of the Lost Son

Luke 15:11-32



### The Younger Son Demands His Inheritance

In Jewish law, the oldest son received two-thirds of the inheritance, and the rest was divided among the other children. Since it appears that there were only two sons, the younger would have been entitled to one-third of the father's holdings. However, Jewish law did not allow a person to sell his father's land inheritance because it had been given by God. So in asking his father to give him the land early, the younger son was maneuvering against the law. Any Jew would have seen what the son was doing and would have refused to buy the land. It was also against the law to sell such land to a Gentile. Since that must have been what the younger son did, the Jews listening to this story would have been appalled.

### The Son Squanders His Inheritance

The next part of the story isn't hard to predict. The younger son foolishly spent his inheritance and was left with nothing. At that point, he realized how wrong he had been and decided to return to his father, hoping only that the father would accept him back as a hired hand. He was convinced that he had sacrificed his right to be his father's son. He now decided to do what he knew was right.

### The Humiliated Father Forgives the Son

Because a family would not normally forgive a son for such a sin, Jesus' listeners would have been extremely surprised and angry to hear that the man ran out to meet his returning son. What Jesus described was a father intent on getting to his son before the neighbors did. Even though the son had turned away, sinned willfully, and disgraced the family name, the father was waiting to forgive his

son and save him from the death he deserved. What a wonderful picture of our God, who watchfully waits, ready to forgive us when we return to him in repentance!

### The Jesus Connection

Picture a God anxious to meet you even when you feel ashamed. Know his love for you, and cherish the relationship you have with Jesus.

Who in your life doesn't "deserve" mercy? "They are just out of options." "They've made their bed..." "This change of heart won't last." Reach out to these people in kindness and joy. Pray for them right now. You can write your prayer here.

When you respond to expressions of negative emotions with loving patience, you are showing a tangible form of forgiveness. Your calmness helps your child to regain composure and to receive the powerful message, "I will care for you no matter how you act." As little ones mature, positive responses can help them learn to accept the forgiveness that Christ offers.

### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Play a game of Hide-and-Seek. When you find your child, remind him or her that the father was happy when he found his lost son and that he was waiting to forgive the boy. Hug your child, and tell him or her how happy you are to see good choices.

Take a trip to a farm or a zoo. Show your child the pigs. Remind him or her how the lost son lived with the pigs and got all dirty, but the father forgave his son for leaving home and gave him new, clean clothes.

# Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet John 13:1-17

When little ones show attempts to be kind or helpful, it's important to recognize and nurture their efforts. While it's not always convenient to give a child time to help, it is a wise investment. When we cut short a kindness (such as an attempt to share a cookie) or a helpful act (such as trying to wipe up a spill), we unintentionally get in the way of an important part of a child's development. When children's attempts at helpfulness are continually thwarted, they may simply quit trying. Thanks for encouraging them to keep trying instead!

# Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

John 13:1-17



BIBLE BACKGROUND

#### Jesus Offers to Perform a Demeaning Task

It is especially significant that Jesus washed the disciples' feet because none of the disciples was willing to stoop below the others to do this demeaning task. The washing of feet, necessary because people in Jesus' day all wore sandals, was customary before the beginning of any meal and was normally done by a servant as guests entered the house. However, since this was a private meal, there was apparently no servant there. The water, the basin, and the towel were there, and certainly the disciples thought about the fact that no one had washed their feet. But none of them took the initiative to do the washing before the meal. After the food had been set out, Jesus took action. John records all this in detail, likely feeling guilty for not being the one to pick up the towel and basin to serve his brothers and his Lord.

# Peter at First Refuses Jesus' Service

.......

Peter's resistance to allowing Jesus to wash his feet revealed that Peter didn't understand what was really happening, part of which was Jesus illustrating the cleansing power of his death. Peter also exhibited pride in his refusal to let Jesus wash his feet. He didn't yet understand that Jesus came to serve, not to be served. Peter's rejection of Jesus' act was based on an understanding of the Messiah that didn't allow for such a humble, servantlike action.

#### Go and Serve Others

Through his actions and words, Jesus commands us to serve one another as he served his disciples, but not specifically in the washing of feet. To claim to be exempt from such service would be to claim to be greater than Jesus himself. And it would not be enough for the disciples to recognize that they were to

serve one another; they needed to take action if they were to receive the blessing promised in John 13:17.

# The Jesus Connection

Jesus' entire mission was one of humility. Imagine a king leaving his posh palace to live as a homeless man, facing abuse and mistreatment. Ridiculous? Absolutely. Why did Jesus do what he did? All for the love of you and me.

Thank Jesus for making a way for you to someday live where he is. Acknowledge that because of him, you don't have to be afraid or ashamed about meeting God. Jesus bent down low to lift you up high. How can you live out your gratitude? Talk to God about that. You can write your prayer here.

## Jesus Is Tried and Crucified

Luke 19:28-40; 23:1-49



#### Jesus Enters Jerusalem on a Donkey

Jesus entered the city riding a colt in order to fulfill the Messianic prophecy in Zechariah 9:9. This was a sign that Jews had been watching for. In addition, a king riding a horse indicated that the king was going into battle, whereas a king riding a donkey was a symbol of peace.

# Pilate Orders Jesus Crucified

Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea, had been less than pleasant to the Jews during his rule. He had taken money from the Temple treasury for a city water project and had brought images from the Roman Empire into the city of Jerusalem. But he knew not to go too far in his irritation of the Jews. If too many complaints about him reached Rome, he might lose his position. So he was likely feeling insecure when the Jews came to him with their request to crucify Jesus. Thus, even though it appears that Pilate felt Jesus was innocent, he was unwilling to stand up against the Jews.

It is significant that Jesus was crucified between two criminals. To the Jews, this indicated that he was a criminal. It seems likely that the religious leaders had exerted their influence to arrange for this positioning as one more way to humiliate Jesus.

#### Darkness Falls When Jesus Is Crucified

When Jesus died, the skies became dark from noon until 3 o'clock in the afternoon when the sun would normally have been at the height of its brilliance. There is no way to explain this darkness as a natural phenomenon. God must have darkened the sun.

The centurion mentioned in Luke 23:47 was a Roman

soldier, loyal to the emperor. Something about what happened as Jesus died made a difference in that man's life. Everyone who witnessed Jesus' death seemed to sense that something very wrong had happened (Luke 23:48).

# The Jesus Connection

With all the demands on our time and attention, it's easy to forget that everything in this life is about Jesus. This one truth is woven into the very fabric of creation. What an honor to be in a loving relationship with Jesus!

Pick up a rock. What does it tell you about God? Its

mere existence is a testimony to the greatness of a Creator with no beginning or end. Invest five minutes in praising God, who created you and loves you. You can write your prayer of praise here.



Whatever your decisions are about Easter bunnies and colored eggs, celebrate this season in ways that will establish meaningful traditions in your family. Traditions bind families together. When those traditions include activities centered on church, they are powerful tools to bind children to the things of God.

#### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

# Jesus Appears to Mary

John 20:1-18



# Mary, John, and Peter Discover an Empty Tomb

It is obvious from Mary's response and from that of the disciples that no one expected Jesus to rise from the dead.

The "other disciple" mentioned in verse 2 was John himself. Even though he arrived at the tomb first, he didn't go in immediately. Bold, impetuous Peter arrived after John and burst into the tomb to see what had happened. The body was gone, but the grave clothes were still there. In fact, the wrap that had been on Jesus' head was folded up, not tossed carelessly as a grave robber might have done. We aren't told of Peter's response, but we see that when John followed him in and saw the position of the grave clothes, John believed.

Peter and John left the tomb, but Mary couldn't. For her, the disappearance of Jesus' body was still a mystery. As she stood outside sobbing, she peered into the tomb and saw two angels sitting there. In her grief, it didn't register who or what they were. Her response to the angels' inquiry indicates that she hadn't grasped what had happened. She was sad because she thought Jesus' body had been taken away. She had no comprehension that Jesus had risen.

# Mary Doesn't Recognize the Risen Jesus

Why did Mary not recognize the Lord she was looking for when she turned around and saw him? Several factors probably contributed to her lack of recognition: She knew he was dead and was not expecting him to be alive, she may not have raised her eyes to really look at him because she didn't want to show her tears, she may not have seen clearly through her tears anyway, and Jesus was now in his glorified body—he may have looked very different from when she had last seen him.

It is interesting that Jesus repeated the same question the angels had asked Mary. The angels and Jesus were both trying to help Mary understand what had actually happened. But she just couldn't comprehend it until Jesus called her name. She knew the voice of Jesus and recognized him.

Repeat this process several times, naming different people who are important to twos.

### Joyful Phrases

Words like *hosanna* and phrases like "Jesus is alive" can be reviewed throughout the year as you listen to praise music or finish a prayer time. These words, and the context in which your child learned them, foreshadow the lifelong joy we can experience as followers of our resurrected Lord.



Using a blanket, play Peekaboo. Tell your child that Jesus appeared to Mary and told her that he is alive.

Decorate Easter eggs. Explain that the empty shells baby chicks leave behind remind us of the empty tomb Jesus left behind.



# **Apostles Defend Their Faith**

Acts 5:12-42



# The Jailed Apostles, Miraculously Freed, Return to the Temple

As described in Acts 4, Peter and John had been brought before the Sanhedrin for questioning and told to stop teaching in the name of Jesus. Frustrated but finding no reason to punish them, the Sanhedrin had to let them go. Now, after performing more miraculous signs and arousing more excitement among the people, all of the apostles were brought in and locked up overnight. The Sanhedrin likely intended to punish them the next day. However, the next morning, the doors and gates to the cell were still securely locked, but the prisoners were gone. Rather than accept the supernatural release of the apostles, the authorities apparently concluded that someone in the Temple police was a sympathizer and had freed the prisoners.

When the apostles were approached in the Temple court again, no force was used to bring them back to the meeting of the Sanhedrin. Had the apostles wanted to resist, the support of the crowd would have made it difficult for the religious leaders to bring them in. But the apostles didn't resist. Notice that the high priest didn't even want to utter the name of Jesus. Perhaps the high priest was afraid that the apostles would make him and the Sanhedrin look guilty for the death of Jesus. His guilt was haunting him, and he was becoming paranoid about the disciples' motives.

# Gamaliel Advises the Sanhedrin to Let the Apostles Go

Peter, responding for all the apostles, was very clear. Members of the Sanhedrin couldn't disagree with the principle; they just disagreed over what it meant to obey God. Mistaken as they were, they thought they were obeying God.

Gamaliel's response to the Sanhedrin was wise. After reminding the Sanhedrin of two people who had commanded followings and later faded away, he advised the Sanhedrin to leave the apostles alone. He said that if what the apostles were doing was simply self-manufactured it would go nowhere, but if it was of God, even the Sanhedrin wouldn't be able to stop it.

Look how many people now know about Jesus! God wants us to spread his love to everyone. He wants us to be his disciples and ▶ TELL OTHERS ABOUT JESUS and his love.

Line up the twos.

Say: Let's be disciples and tell our friends about Jesus. Instruct the first child in line to turn to the child behind him or her and say, "Jesus loves you." That child will then turn to the next child and say, "Jesus loves you." The children should pass the message until everyone in the line has had a turn. Be sure to have the last child in line tell the first child.

Say: You did a great job telling your friends about Jesus. God wants us to tell everyone about Jesus. Let's join hands and pray. God, help us be good disciples and tell other people about your Son, Jesus. In Jesus' name, amen.





## Saul Meets Jesus Near Damascus

Acts 9:1-20



BIBLE BACKGROUND

# Saul Encounters Jesus on the Damascus Road

Saul was traveling to Damascus to arrest Christians when Jesus met him on the road. A light he later described as "brighter than the sun" (Acts 26:13) flashed out of heaven, and he dropped to the ground. When Jesus questioned Saul, Saul's question in return was genuine. The term *lord* can refer simply to a person of superior standing. It seems that Saul really didn't know who was addressing him. When Jesus told him who he was, the truth of all that had happened must have swept through Saul like a flood. All that Saul had believed about Jesus was wrong, and in his zeal for God, he had been persecuting those who believed what was true!

# Blinded Saul Is Told to Wait for Instructions

It's interesting that Jesus told Saul that he was to go into the city and wait for instructions and that Saul was blinded and remained that way as he waited in Damascus for three days. We can only speculate on what went through Saul's mind during that time, but he must have been going through all the Old Testament Scriptures stored in his memory, sorting out how Jesus could be the Messiah in spite of Saul's earlier belief. God gave him time to think!

### Ananias Helps Saul

Saul's meeting with Ananias introduces another aspect of the story. Imagine the faith it took for Ananias to seek out the man he probably knew was coming to town to arrest him and other Christians. How better could the Christians there and around Judea have found out about the change in Saul? God definitely knows what he is doing!

Why did God choose Saul? God could have used anyone. Perhaps he chose Saul to be a supreme example of how a life can be changed when God enters it. It is often suggested that Saul of Tarsus became Paul after this conversion. The truth is that "Saul" was his Jewish name but "Paul" was the Roman equivalent by which he became better known.

# The Jesus Connection

Maybe you haven't experienced that kind of "Road to Damascus" conversion, and that's okay. The road that brought you to a relationship with Jesus doesn't matter. What is important is whether or not you are making the most of your journey with him.



# Jesus Changes Saul

### What You'll Do

Gather the 2-year-olds around the teaching picture. Open your Bible to Acts 9.

Say: In the Bible we read about a man named Saul. Saul was a mean man and did not like people who believed in Jesus. Show me your meanest face. Show children your mean face, too. That's how Saul looked when he heard the name of Jesus.

One day Saul and some friends were walking along the road. All of a sudden, a very bright light flashed all around the men. Choose one of the children to flip the classroom light switch on and off several times. Show me what you think Saul did when he saw the light. Give twos time to respond.

Spread out the "Saul Meets Jesus" poster on the floor.

Say: Let's show how bright that light was by putting shiny stickers on this poster.

Give each child a few shiny stickers (such as foil stars) to stick over the light shining on Saul in the poster. Then hang the poster on the wall where kids can see it.

Turn on the flashlight, and shine it on the "Saul" teaching picture.

Say: The light was so bright that Saul couldn't see. Jesus asked, "Why are you hurting people who love me?" Jesus told Saul to go to the city and wait. Saul waited (cross your arms over your chest) and prayed (make praying hands) for three days. Encourage the children to join you in the movements. Then Jesus allowed Saul to see again. And Jesus changed Saul's mean face (have the children show their meanest faces) to a kind face (have the children smile). Jesus gave Saul a new life. Now mean Saul is known as Jesus' friend.

## Peter Raises Tabitha From the Dead

Acts 9:36-43



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

### Peter Arrives to Find Tabitha Dead

It appears from the text that no one thought to send for Peter until after Tabitha had died. Peter was in Lydda, about nine miles away. It would have taken about five or six hours to bring him from there, so it was necessary for him to hurry. If he delayed, the people in Joppa would have to bury Tabitha's body.

When Peter entered the room, he sent away the widows and the mourners, just as Jesus had done when he raised Jairus' daughter in Mark 5. Peter wanted some time to be alone with the Lord. Peter knew what the Christians in Joppa wanted him to do, and he no doubt expressed that to God. But he undoubtedly wanted to find out what the Lord wanted to do. From Peter's actions, it is apparent that the Lord gave Peter the direction he needed. Peter then used the same wording that Jesus had used in raising Jairus' daughter, with the exception of one letter: "Tabitha arise," instead of "Talitha arise."

### Miracles Establish the Apostles' Credibility

•••••

How did Tabitha hear Peter's command if she was dead? As Peter spoke, the Lord returned her to life. The Lord made Tabitha hear and arise. She was instantaneously and completely restored. The disease was gone, and any decay that had taken place since death was wiped away. Imagine the joyous scene when Peter presented Tabitha alive to the crowd!

The result of this miracle, as with other miracles the apostles performed, was that many believed in the Lord. Miracles testify to God's power and encourage people in their faith.

# The Jesus Connection

Thanks to Jesus, who offers life—not just beyond but through death. No amount of bleakness can fade the wonder of this miracle.

Think about Peter's previous goof-ups and how God

ultimately used him as a key leader in the startup of the church. God goes beyond forgiveness; he restores. What do you feel ashamed of? Confess your shortcomings to him now, and experience complete healing. You can write your prayer here.

### **Bedside Manner**

#### What You'll Do

Have you ever been so sick that you had to stay in bed? How did you feel? Allow children time to respond.

Say: When Peter heard what had happened, he went to her house and prayed that God would do a miracle. Show the Peter finger puppet. He prayed that Tabitha would be well. Direct the children to make praying hands.

Peter knew God answered his prayer, so he told Tabitha to get up. Lead children in saying, "Get up, Tabitha!" Tabitha got up. Have the Tabitha finger puppet get up. Let's remove the bandages on Tabitha to show that God made her well.



# An Angel Frees Peter From Jail

Acts 12:1-18



### BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

#### Herod Imprisons Peter and Intends to Kill Him

Herod wanted to make sure that Christian sympathizers would not be able to release Peter. Herod assigned four groups of four soldiers each to take turns guarding Peter—one soldier on each side of Peter and two at his cell door. These measures were extraordinary for such a prisoner.

Acts 12:5 describes something of a competition: Peter was securely in prison, guarded by 16 of Rome's finest, handcuffed to a guard on each side of him. But on the other hand, God's people were praying earnestly for Peter on the night that Herod intended to be Peter's last night on earth.

# An Angel Helps Peter Escape

From the text, we know that Peter thought he was having a vision as he was released from prison. He had been awakened from sleep and suspected that he was only dreaming. Only after Peter's chains had fallen off, after he and the angel had walked through the gates to the street, and after the angel had led him down the first street, did Peter come to the realization that he was really free and that God had worked a series of miracles to free him.

#### Peter Surprises Those Praying for Him

The scene that unfolded when Peter arrived at Mark's mother's house is somewhat comical. Rhoda, the servant girl, came to see who was knocking at the door in the middle of the night. When she realized it was Peter, she was so excited that she ran back to tell the others without unlocking the door! And then the people who had been earnestly praying for Peter refused to believe that he could really be at the gate. Instead, they may have jumped to the conclusion that

Peter was already dead and that his guardian angel had come to tell them the news. And all the while, Peter was standing outside knocking. When they went to the door to see for themselves, they were astonished by the truth.

in the jail. "Wake up! Wake up!" said the angel. Give each child one small piece of satin or other smooth, shiny fabric. Lay out the "Angel Frees Peter" poster on the floor. Spread a thin layer of glue over the angel's clothes in the picture. Encourage children to stick their pieces of fabric on the glue.

Have the child with the flashlight shine the light on the teaching picture.

Say: The angel helped Peter get away from the jail. Until the picture of Peter, and hand it to a 2-year-old. Peter left quickly. Have the child with the Peter figure run around the story area one time. Everyone, show me how excited Peter and his friends must have been.

Retell the story several times, allowing different children to use the flashlight and hold the Peter figure.

# Music Makers

# God Alters Paul's Plans

Although Paul had other plans, he didn't hesitate to change them when he had clear direction from God in a vision. The text says that they "got ready at once to leave for Macedonia." And looking back on the effect Paul's missionary journeys had on that part of the world, we see that God's strategy in leading Paul where he did only improved Paul's original plan.

Whenever Paul came to a new city, he made it a practice to go to the local Jewish synagogue on the Sabbath to see if an opportunity would arise to share the message of Jesus with the Jews meeting there. However, there must not have been a synagogue in Philippi. It took 10 Jewish males to constitute a synagogue, but Jewish men must have been lacking. Instead, a group of Jewish or God-fearing women met at an informal meeting place outside the city. Paul and his team found this meeting and told the women there about Jesus. Paul didn't hesitate to give them his time and attention. He wanted to reach everyone he could with God's message of grace.

### Lydia Becomes the First European Convert

Lydia, the leader of this little group, was a dealer in purple cloth. Purple dye was extremely costly, and anyone able to deal in it had to be wealthy. For a woman to be successful and wealthy on her own was unusual in that culture, and it says a lot about Lydia. This woman was the first person in Europe who Paul led to faith in Christ.

Why were all the members of Lydia's household baptized? Though Luke concentrates on the story of Lydia, that doesn't mean that others in her family weren't present and didn't believe on their own. Her children and any servants in her household likely followed her example and believed in Jesus.

# The Jesus Connection

Paul didn't waste time wondering about what God wanted. He knew. As you spend time with Jesus through Bible study and prayer, sense his will for you and make it your own.

Lydia was a standout in her society, impressive by any standard. Do you feel intimidated by others and too timid to share the love of Christ with them? Even the least "needy" need Jesus. Choose one person to share God's love with in the coming week. Pray for that person. You can write your prayer here.

Have your toddler sit with the coffee can (with the lid on it) in front of him or her.

Say: Lydia sold purple cloth, but she needed Jesus. Have the toddler push the cloth through the slit into the coffee can. Then give the plastic coin to the toddler. Lydia had plenty of money, but she still needed Jesus. Have the toddler push the plastic coin through the slit into the can. But when Lydia found Jesus, she had all she needed. Allow the toddler to push the Jesus picture into the can.

Cut out a cross from purple poster board. Cut a 16-inch piece of yarn. Let your 2-year-old help you use a hole punch to place a hole near the top of the cross. Then let your child string the cross onto the yarn. Tie the ends, and place the necklace around your child's neck.

Say: When you wear this necklace, the cross can remind you that we all need Jesus.



#### We All Need Jesus

Sociologists and educators tell us that children become aware of physical differences between people as early as two years of age. Help your child learn that regardless of our physical characteristics, we are all the same in our need of a Savior.



## Paul's Jailer Believes in Jesus

Acts 16:16-34



# Paul Casts a Demon Out of a Girl and Ends Up in Jail

When Paul cast the demon out of the girl, she lost her ability to tell fortunes. Therefore, her owners saw Paul's actions as an attack on their property. They saw Paul and his companions as Jews propagating outlandish beliefs. On the basis of the owners' accusations, Paul and Silas were flogged and put in jail.

This time when God freed his servants from jail, he essentially freed everyone in the jail. Why didn't everyone flee? Perhaps they stayed because of the impression Paul and Silas had on them when they were singing hymns at midnight in spite of their chains!

The Romans dealt severely with jailers who were unable to deliver their prisoners at the appointed time. Assuming that all the prisoners had escaped as a result of the earthquake opening the gates, the jailer thought he would die at the hands of his superiors. Taking his own life seemed a better choice at that point. Only a shout from Paul stopped him. When the jailer realized that all the prisoners were still there, he was ready to accept Paul's message. And Paul's message was clear: "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved."

# The Jailer Takes Paul and Silas to His Home

.....

It was not against any rule for the jailer to take Paul and Silas to his own home. The jailer was commissioned only to produce the prisoners when they were called for. After what had happened that night, he probably didn't fear that they would try to escape. Instead, he took care of their wounds from the flogging, gave them some good food, and rejoiced in the salvation he had received. Paul and Silas undoubtedly realized that the flogging and imprisonment they had endured were worth the joy that salvation had brought to the Philippian jailer!

All of a sudden, a mighty earthquake came. God sent an earthquake to shake the jail. Show children how to shake, rock back and forth, and bounce up and down. The doors flew open. Put your hands together in front of you, and then throw them open wide. Have the children do the same. And the chains came off.

The guard was really afraid! He thought the prisoners had escaped. He would be in big trouble! Show me a scared look. Look at children's scared faces. But Paul said to the jailer, "Do not be afraid. We are all still here." The jailer asked Paul how he could be saved, too. Paul told him he must believe in Jesus. Jesus saved the jailer and the jailer's family. ▶ JESUS SAVES US, too.



Show the twos the teaching picture.



# Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit

Romans 8:9-17



## BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

#### The Holy Spirit Helps Us Resist Sin

In Romans 8:5-8, Paul gives a description of living by the sinful nature—which ends in death. That's where today's passage picks up: Paul describes what it looks like to live according to the Holy Spirit. He begins by making it clear that Christians have the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, living in them. And with that Spirit within, we can resist the pull of the sinful nature (Romans 8:9).

In Romans 8:11, Paul points out that the Holy Spirit not only helps us keep from sinning but also brings us resurrection from the dead—eternal life. If God raised up Jesus and God's Spirit is dwelling in us, God can raise us up as well!

# Our Response to the Holy Spirit

Paul changes gears somewhat in Romans 8:12-13, turning from what God does for us through the Holy Spirit to what our responsibility is in response to what God has done for us. If we follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in our lives rather than our sinful nature, we will live. The death to sin that God has accomplished for us doesn't mean that we don't have to worry about sin in our lives; instead it makes it possible for us to turn from sinning and even obligates us to do so!

Romans 8:15-17 turns back to what God has done for us. When we live by God's Spirit, not only are we able to turn from sin and be cleansed from sin through Jesus' sacrifice, but we also are adopted as children of God himself! And in first-century culture, an adopted child wasn't in any way inferior to a natural child. In fact, the adopted child was deliberately chosen by a father for the purpose of carrying on his name, which was a great honor.

We can call God *Abba*, an Aramaic word by which children would lovingly address their fathers.

## The Jesus Connection

Great freedom comes when, after every effort imaginable, you realize nothing you do on your own can win right standing with God. It can be found only by accepting a gift with humility and gratitude. The gift? A relationship with Jesus.

Pray this prayer today: "God, you did more than

forgive me. You accepted me. I can hardly believe you think of me as your child. Make this so real to me that I am changed through and through." You can write your prayer here.

## Finding God's Child

#### What You'll Do

Lay an infant on a blanket in front of you. Have the mirror hidden behind you. Hold the infant's hand.

Say: Paul wrote a letter to his friends. Trace imaginary letters on the baby's palm as you speak. He said, "You can live for God, and you can be God's child. Gently cross the baby's arms over his or her chest in a hug. God's Spirit can help you live for him. Point to the sky with the baby's arm. You do not have to be afraid. #### Pleasing Pointers

To very young children, living for God means learning to be what God wants them to be—such as good. kind, and loving. Their best role models are the ones they see in their own homes every day. Affirm that kindness and goodness are part of your family's identity: "Because we love Jesus, this is how we act in our family." Don't teach from only wrongdoing, but rather, try to find positive examples. When your child puts away a toy, say, "I like the way you're living for God by being a good helper." Your child will learn the most when your teaching connects with what he or she does and is interested in.




Look through picture books, and have your child point out the children in the pictures. Then say, "These kids can be God's children, too—they can live for him."

## Paul Describes Genuine Love

1 Corinthians 13:1-13



## What Is True Love?

The "love" we see in movies, on TV, and in our culture is not the kind of love described in this passage. What we most often see is a selfish "love," which is more like lust. That kind of love seeks its own pleasure and gratification, sometimes at the expense of others. The love Paul describes in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 is precisely the opposite. It's directed at seeking the pleasure and good of others. It means turning aside from seeking what's pleasurable for ourselves and seeking instead what's best for others—as Jesus did. As we become more loving, we're becoming more like Jesus.

## Paul Describes Mature Love

Paul then turns to an analogy of childhood versus adulthood. The things we did and thought as children were pretty important to us then, and we thought we were doing pretty well. But when we become adults, we see how insignificant some of the things that had been important to us were and how poorly we sometimes did them, and we don't think of things or do things in the same way anymore.

In understanding Paul's mirror metaphor, it's important to note that the mirrors of Paul's day didn't reflect perfect images. Most likely the mirror he spoke of was of polished metal and would have reflected at best an unclear image. The connection, then, was that now we see the things of God but not very clearly and accurately. When we meet God face to face, our vision will be perfectly clear!

## Faith, Hope, and Love Endure

In 1 Corinthians 13:8, Paul departs from talking about the importance of love and emphasizes its permanence. Other things such as prophecies, tongues, and knowledge will one day be gone. To wrap up this passage, Paul returns to the prominence

of love. He points out that faith and hope are important and will endure. But he echoes the principle of love being over all.

#### **The Jesus Connection**

It's so hard for people who have been corrupted by sin to be loving. Gratefully, we can learn from Jesus' example of how he lived on this earth.

Read 1 Corinthians 13 again, and make a list of the

#### What You'll Do

Gather a few toddlers around you.

Say: Let's play a game and show kindness to each other. I'm going to pretend that I have a boo-boo. I think I'll have a boo-boo right here on my finger.

Ask:

Can someone help me put a bandage on it? Give a child an adhesive bandage, and guide him or her in placing it on your finger.

Say: How kind of you! Thank you so much. Oh, dear—I think I am getting a headache. Maybe I'd better lie down. Lie down on a mat. I would like to be covered up.

Ask:

Will you help me? Allow children to cover you with a blanket.

Say: My head hurts so much. A cool, wet cloth would make me feel so much better. Guide children in pretending to use an empty water bottle to "wet" a washcloth. Then lie very still while children place the cloth on your forehead.

Say: Oh, I am feeling so much better. Thank you so much for showing me acts of kindness. You must really love me. ► GOD'S LOVE IS KIND, and God wants our love to be kind, too.

## Shiny, Sweet Hearts

#### What You'll Do

Give each child a copy of the "Showing Kindness and Love" page.


Say: Children are being kind in these pictures. They must have hearts full of love. Point out the various scenes, and discuss what the boys and girls are doing. Set out heart stickers.

All of these children are showing love. Let's give each child a heart. Guide toddlers in attaching heart stickers to the children in the pictures. Being kind makes people feel good. ## Window Scenes

Say: Paul lived in Bible times. Paul was one of Jesus' friends. Paul knew all about God's love. Paul told everyone that ▶ GOD'S LOVE IS KIND. Open the window that reveals the picture of two children hugging. Look how these children are hugging. They are showing love.

Ask:

**Can you hug someone?** Allow time for hugging, and then open the window that shows the family sharing a Bible.

Say: Look how this family is being kind to each other. They are sharing a Bible. Open the window that shows the child kicking a dog.

Ask:

Is this child being kind to the dog? Allow children to respond.

Say: No, there is no kindness or love here. Open the window that shows children fighting.

Ask:

**Are these children being kind?** Pause for children's responses; then open the window that shows a child helping another child stand up.

Say: Here is an act of kindness. There is love here. Let's act this one out! Lead children in helping each other up from the floor. Hugging, sharing, and helping one another are examples of kindness. These acts show love.

## Kindly Praise

Help your child understand kindness, not only by your actions but by providing opportunities for him or her to demonstrate kind actions. Say things such as "It would be kind to share the doll now" or "Let's be kind and put the toys away." Praise your child for showing kindness, and remind him or her that Jesus loves to see us acting kindly.

#### Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Help your child pet a family dog or cat. Teach your child to touch the animal gently. Remind your child that love is kind.

Look at a picture book that shows Jesus performing acts of kindness. Talk about how much Jesus desires to do good things for his children because he loves us so much.
