For donated toys and gifts, we are looking for:


- Christmas toys and gifts for children from newborn to 17 years of age.



Second Amendment for the Restated Bylaws of Lakewood Forest Fund, Inc.

STATE OF TEXAS §

 $\$ KNOW All MEN by These Presents: County of Harris $\$

This is the Second Amendment for the Restated Bylaws of Lakewood Forest Fund, Inc. (the "First Amendment").

WHEREAS, a certain instrument entitled Restated Bylaws of Lakewood Forest Fund, Inc. ("Bylaws") was recorded and filed in the Official Public Records of Real Property of Harris County, Texas, Doc. No. 529-75-3557 through 529-75-3569.

WHEREAS, a certain instrument entitled First Amendment for the Restated Bylaws of Lakewood Forest Fund, Inc. was recorded and filed in the Official Public Records of Real Property of Harris County, Texas, Doc. No. RP-2018-33624.

WHEREAS, a majority of a quorum of the Members present, in person, or by proxy, at a Special Meeting approved of this Second Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, Article III, Section 1 is deleted in its entirety, and hereby replaced with the following:

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

Section 1. Annual Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the membership shall be held on any Monday in the first quarter, with proper notification as outlined in the Texas Property Code, at 7:00 p.m., for purposes of electing Trustees and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the membership. Upon completion of voting for Trustees, the Board of Trustees (at its discretion by majority vote) may adjourn the meeting, without notice other than announcement at the meeting, and reconvene the Annual Meeting on a later date for the purpose of announcing the election results. If the day of the Annual Meeting is a legal holiday in the State of Texas, the Annual Meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day. Additional regular meetings of the membership may be scheduled by the Board of Trustees at its discretion, if such meetings are deemed necessary.

"CRASE" Presentation

Disaster response psychology and human stress response will be covered along with the survival strategy of Avoid, Deny, and Defend. This presentation is for adult participants only and contains some real-life materials such as audio and video that some may find disturbing.

Gardening Hints From the Pro, Sherri



December To-Do List

In the Lawn – Your lawn should be in a dormant state and there's not much to do at this point. Make sure to back off your water while the lawn is dormant but make sure to water if we are going to have freezing temperatures.

In the Flowerbeds – Deadhead and feed cool season color plants with Color Star Fertilizer. Continue to plant cool weather color: pansies, snapdragons, cabbage, kale, viola, alyssum, lobelia, cyclamen, and much more.

In the Veggie Garden – Work compost into the top couple inches of your garden beds. Plant a cover crop in empty beds such as peas, oats, or rye to keep the soil active. These cover crops can be cut and worked into the soil before spring planting. You can still plant cool weather seeds about every two weeks for fresh veggies into spring.

Feed the birds! – Don't forget to keep seed feeders full and fresh water in bird baths. Put out suet cakes. The extra protein helps keep our feathered friends warm in the winter months.

Poinsettias – Water well until soil is saturated and allow to dry between waterings. Apply water to soil and not the foliage or blooms. Keep away from drafts.

Freezes – Have frost cloth on hand to cover tender plants in case of freezing weather. Wrap plants completely down to ground level. The fewer cold drafts move under the frost cloth, the better.






Admission is always free, but a suggested donation of \$5 per adult is appreciated. Annual memberships are available starting at just \$30, with a variety of levels and benefits.




